5	Under existing law, a juror receives mileage
6	reimbursement of \$0.05 per mile traveled for court and
7	receives \$10 per day for an expense allowance.
8	This bill would allow the Alabama Supreme Court
9	to increase the mileage rate and expense allowance by
10	order or rule.

17	Relating to courts; to amend Section 12-19-210, Code of
18	Alabama 1975, to increase the expense allowance and mileage
19	reimbursement paid to jurors by order or rule.
20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. Section 12-19-210, Code of Alabama 1975, is
22	amended to read as follows:
23	"§12-19-210
24	(a) Regular jurors, grand and petit, shall be entitled
25	to <del>\$10.00 <u>an</u> expense allowance for each day's services<del>, \$.05</del></del>
26	for each and an amount for each mile traveled in going to and
27	returning from court and ferriage and toll, to be proved by
28	the oath of the juror before the clerk of the court. The clerk

29	shall give each juror a certificate, stating therein the
30	number of days he has served, the number of miles he has
31	traveled, the amount of ferriage and toll he has paid and the
32	amount of expense allowance to which he is entitled.
33	(b) The Alabama Supreme Court, by order or rule, shall
34	establish the amount of expense allowance and mileage to be
35	paid to each juror.
36	(c) The certificate monies paid shall be payable out of
37	the State Treasury from funds appropriated to the
38	Administrative Office of Courts by the Legislature.
39	(b) The provisions of this section shall be retroactive
40	to May 23, 1977."
41	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first
42	day of the third month following its passage and approval by
43	the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
