SYNOPSIS:
Under existing law, a juror receives mileage reimbursement of $\$ 0.05$ per mile traveled for court and receives $\$ 10$ per day for an expense allowance.

This bill would allow the Alabama Supreme Court to increase the mileage rate and expense allowance by order or rule.

A BILL
TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

Relating to courts; to amend Section 12-19-210, Code of Alabama 1975, to increase the expense allowance and mileage reimbursement paid to jurors by order or rule. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 12-19-210, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:
"\$12-19-210
(a) Regular jurors, grand and petit, shall be entitled to $\$ 10.00$ an expense allowance for each day's services, $\$ .05$ for each and an amount for each mile traveled in going to and returning from court and ferriage and toll, to be proved by the oath of the juror before the clerk of the court. The clerk

shall give each juror a certificate, stating thercin the number of days he has served, the number of miles he has traveled, the amount of ferriage and toll he has paid and the amount of expense allownee to which he is entitled.
(b) The Alabama Supreme Court, by order or rule, shall establish the amount of expense allowance and mileage to be paid to each juror.
(c) The ecrtificate-monies paid shall be payable out of the State Treasury from funds appropriated to the Administrative Office of Courts by the Legislature.
(b) The provisions of this section shall be retroactive to May 23, 1977."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
