8	AN ACT
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10	Relating to the Volunteer Rescue Squad Tuition
11	Reimbursement Act of 2018; to amend Sections 22-18-60,
12	22-18-61, 22-18-63, and 22-18-64, Code of Alabama 1975, to
13	decrease the required contracted for service time after
14	graduation and licensing from three years to two years; to
15	expand the program to include students who contract and
16	provide service to ambulance services; to provide exclusions
17	from reimbursement; and to increase the amount of operational
18	expenses reimbursed to the Alabama Community College System;
19	and to add Section 22-18-61.1 to the Code of Alabama 1975, to
20	provide for the retroactive reimbursement of certain fees and
21	expenses.
22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. Sections 22-18-60, 22-18-61, 22-18-63, and
24	22-18-64 of the Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as
25	follows:

27	For the purposes of this article, the following terms
28	shall have the following meanings:



29 (1) ACCS. The Alabama Community College System. 30 (2) AMBULANCE SERVICE. An ambulance service located in 31 this state which is a member of the Alabama Association of 32 Ambulance Services. 33 (2) (3) ASSOCIATIONS. The Alabama Association of Rescue Squads-or, the Alabama Association of Volunteer Fire 34 35 Departments, or the Alabama Association of Ambulance Services. 36 (3) (4) EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSONNEL (EMSP). All 37 recognized levels of personnel licensed by the Alabama Department of Public Health, who have met all primary—and/or 38 39 or renewal educational requirements, or both, set by the Alabama Department of Public Health, and who are allowed to 40 provide medical care within the level of their scope of 41 42 practice granted by the Office of Emergency Medical Services 43 (OEMS) within the Alabama Department of Public Health. (4) (5) FIRE COLLEGE. The Alabama Fire College. 44 (5) (6) STUDENT. A student enrolled in an emergency 45 46 medical services certification program at a member institution 47 of the Alabama Community College System ACCS, the Alabama Fire 48 College fire college, or the University of South Alabama. 49 (7) TUITION COSTS. Includes the actual cost of tuition 50 and fees required to complete an approved course of 51 instruction for EMSP certification, as determined by each 52 eligible educational institution. 53 (6) (8) VOLUNTEER RESCUE SQUAD. A volunteer rescue squad 54 located in the State of Alabama and is a member of the Alabama Association of Rescue Squads. 55 56 (7) (9) VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT. A volunteer fire

51	(a) The Alabama Community College System ACCS, the
52	Alabama Fire College fire college, and the University of South
53	Alabama, in consultation with the associations, shall jointly
54	develop and administer a student tuition reimbursement program
55	for students that agree in the form of an enforceable who
56	contract—agreement, to provide two years of emergency medical
57	services for volunteer rescue squads-or, volunteer fire
58	departments in Alabama, or ambulance services after becoming a
59	licensed EMSP subject to the student agreeing to provide three
7 0	years of service to a volunteer rescue squad or volunteer fire

72	(b) $\underline{\text{(1)}}$ Tuition reimbursement under this article shall
73	be the actual cover tuition costs paid by the student

77	is a member. Tuition paid by the volunteer rescue squad,

31	(2) Tuition reimbursement under this article shall not
32	include any tuition costs covered by grants or other monetary
33	awards provided to a student including, but not limited to,
3 4	federal education grants and scholarships, as determined by

- (3) Tuition costs shall not be reimbursed until the student provides ACCS and the associations with documentation that he or she has successfully completed the approved course of instruction, proof of passing the certification exam, production of a valid EMSP license from the Alabama Department of Public Health and a contractual agreement to comply with the service requirements.
- (c) In the event that a tuition reimbursement recipient fails to meet the service requirements for any reason other than extreme hardship as defined within the joint agreement required in Section 22-18-64(b), the individual shall be deemed to have breached the underlying contract and shall be liable in the form of monetary damages to the state for the immediate repayment of the total tuition—amount\_costs reimbursed, plus interest at the rate of eight percent. The associations shall notify ACCS of recipients who fail to meet the service requirements.
- (d) Beginning with the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the amount of tuition reimbursement available to students shall be divided among volunteer fire departments, rescue squads, and ambulance services based on available appropriations. The ACCS shall create operational procedures to ensure that funds and volunteer service commitments are split equitably among volunteer fire departments, rescue squads, and ambulance services. Notwithstanding the foregoing, priority shall be given to volunteer fire departments, rescue squads, and nonprofit ambulance services."

- 114 (a) The tuition reimbursement program is subject to 115 direct appropriations from the Education Trust Fund.
  - (b) Any monies appropriated for the program that are unexpended at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert, but shall be carried forward for use of the program in the next fiscal year.
  - (c) Beginning in the 2024-2025 fiscal year, any unexpended funds in excess of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) shall be transferred to the fire college to provide emergency medical services equipment and operations grants to volunteer fire departments and rescue squads. Grants shall be approved by the Alabama Joint Fire Council."

(a) The ACCS shall annually report on the condition and accomplishments of the tuition reimbursement program to the Governor, Speaker of the House of Representatives, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Chair of the House Ways and Means Education Committee, the Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation Education Committee, and the Deputy Director of the Legislative Services Agency, Fiscal Division. The report shall include the number of students participating in the program and the amount of tuition reimbursed for the reporting year. The member institutions of the ACCS, the Fire College fire college, and the University of South Alabama shall provide this information to ACCS for inclusion in the annual report. The report shall be submitted by the fifth legislative day of

each regular session of the Legislature.



141	(b) The ACCS, the Fire College fire college, and the
142	University of South Alabama shall enter into a joint agreement
143	to implement and administer the tuition reimbursement program,
144	which shall include provisions for ensuring that operational
145	expenses for the program in a fiscal year do not exceed two 10
146	percent of the funding for the program in that fiscal year.
147	The joint agreement shall provide for limiting the acceptance
148	of applications for the program or limiting tuition
149	reimbursements when necessary, or both.
150	(c) Any monies received for the operations of the
151	tuition reimbursement program, including repayments, interest,
152	and penalties paid because of failure to honor service
153	requirements, shall be used to fund tuition reimbursements."
154	Section 2. Section 22-18-61.1 is added to the Code of
155	Alabama 1975, to read as follows:
156	§22-18-61.1
157	Upon written request by an association or a member of
158	an association, the ACCS may retroactively consider
159	reimbursement of actual tuition costs, excluding required
160	fees, provided by the association or its members to a student
161	to pay his or her eligible tuition costs.
162	Section 3. Section 1 of this act shall become effective
163	on the first day of the third month following its passage and
164	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
165	Section 2 of this act shall become effective immediately
166	following its passage and approval by the Covernor or its
