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SYNOPSIS:

5 Under existing law, it is a crime to impersonate 6 a peace officer.

This bill would further provide for the definition of "peace officer".

Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

39	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
40	Section 1. Section 13A-10-11, Code of Alabama 1975, is
41	amended to read as follows:
42	"\$13A-10-11
43	(a) A person commits the crime of impersonating a peace
44	officer if he or she falsely pretends to be a peace officer
45	and does any act in that capacity.
46	(b) Impersonating a peace officer is a Class C felony.
47	(c) For the purposes of this section, "peace officer"
48	includes any officer or employee of the federal government
49	vested by law with a duty to maintain public order or to make
50	arrests for crimes, whether that duty extends to all crimes or
51	is limited to specific crimes."
52	Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose
53	or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of
54	local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements
55	and application under Section 111.05 of the Constitution of
56	Alabama of 2022 because the bill defines a new crime or amends



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- 57 the definition of an existing crime.
- Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first
- day of the third month following its passage and approval by
- the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
