

# HB276 INTRODUCED

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SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, when the office of the sheriff of a county is vacant or in certain other circumstances when existing law has provided that it is not appropriate for the sheriff to serve, the county coroner discharges the duties of the sheriff.

This bill would provide that when the office of sheriff is vacant or when certain other circumstances exist, the highest ranking deputy sheriff in the county would serve as acting sheriff.

A BILL  
TO BE ENACTED  
AN ACT

Relating to sheriffs; to provide for the acting sheriff when the office of sheriff of a county is vacant or when certain other circumstances exist in the county; and to repeal Section 11-5-5 of the Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the county coroner serving as sheriff when the office of sheriff is vacant or when certain other circumstances exist in the county.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. For the purpose of maintaining order and avoiding the disruption in the provision of law enforcement



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29 services and the operation of the county jail, the highest  
30 ranking deputy sheriff in the office of the sheriff shall  
31 discharge the duties of the sheriff when any of the following  
32 apply:

33 (1) When the office of the sheriff is vacant and until  
34 a successor is qualified.

35 (2) When the sheriff is incompetent to act.

36 (3) When the sheriff is imprisoned.

37 (4) In any civil or criminal proceeding in which the  
38 sheriff is a party.

39 (5) In any case when directed by the judge of probate.

40 Section 2. Section 11-5-5 of the Code of Alabama 1975,  
41 relating to the county coroner serving as sheriff under  
42 certain conditions, is repealed.

43 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first  
44 day of the third month following its passage and approval by  
45 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
