- 17 (3) LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER. An officer employed by the

- 19 Police Officer's Standards and Training Commission and who has

- 21 (4) PERSONAL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION. Includes, but is

- b. Photographs or information of the victim's children,
