5	Under existing law, if a pharmacist receives a
6	request for a prescription refill and a refill
7	authorization is not readily available from the
8	prescriber, the pharmacist may dispense a one-time
9	emergency refill containing up to a 72-hour supply
LO	under certain conditions.
1	This bill would increase the amount of supply of
12	medication in an emergency prescription refill to
L3	include the smallest dispensable package size of a
L 4	medication.
L 5	The bill would also specify that an emergency
L 6	refill does not apply to a Schedule I or II controlled
L 7	substance and would require the pharmacist to notify
L 8	the prescriber within 24 hours after dispensing the

- 39 prescription refill and the pharmacist is unable to readily
- 40 obtain refill authorization from the prescriber, the
- 41 pharmacist may dispense a one-time emergency refill of up to a
- 42 72-hour supply or the smallest dispensable package size,
- 43 whichever is less, of the prescribed medication, providing
- 44 that all of the following apply:
- 45 (1) The prescription is not a medicinal agent listed in
- 46 Schedule I or II appearing in pursuant to Title 20, Chapter 2,
- or the list of controlled substances maintained by the State
- 48 Board of Health.
- 49 (2) The medication is essential to the maintenance of
- 50 life or the continuation of therapy in a chronic condition.
- Only those drugs designated by a joint rule adopted by the
- 52 Board of Pharmacy and Board of Medical Examiners shall be
- refilled, according to the procedure established in this
