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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, five million dollars or so
6	much as is necessary to maintain a balance of two
7	million dollars is appropriated to the Local Government
8	Pistol Permit Revenue Loss Fund every year for three
9	years beginning October 1, 2023.
10	This bill would change the name of the fund to
11	the Sheriffs' Advancement in Education, Technology, and
12	Training Fund, and would appropriate seven million five
13	hundred thousand dollars to the fund every year for
14	five years beginning October 1, 2023.
15	This bill would further provide for the deposit
16	and allocation of grant reimbursement monies.
17	This bill would also make nonsubstantive,
18	technical revisions to update the existing code
19	language to current style.

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Relating to sheriffs; to amend Act 2022-133, 2022
Regular Session, now appearing as Section 41-23-9, Code of Alabama 1975, to change the name of the Local Government

- 35 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 36 Section 1. Act 2022-133, 2022 Regular Session, now
- 37 appearing as Section 41-23-9, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended
- 38 to read as follows:
- 39 **"**\$41-23-9
- 40 (a) There is created in the State Treasury a fund to be
- 41 known as the <del>Local Covernment Pistol Permit Revenue Loss</del>
- 42 FundSheriffs' Advancement in Education, Technology, and
- Training Fund, into which there is automatically appropriated
- 44 five million dollars (\$5,000,000) annually or so much as
- 45 necessary to maintain a balance of two million dollars
- 46 (\$2,000,000) in the fund, seven million five hundred thousand
- 47 dollars (\$7,500,000) at the beginning of each fiscal year for
- 48 the three five fiscal years following January 1, 2023 beginning
- 49 October 1, 2023. The fund shall consist of both of the
- 50 following:
- 51 (1) All appropriations made to the fund.
- 52 (2) Any gifts, grants, or donations made to the fund
- from any source.
- 54 (b) The Alabama Department of Economic and Community
- 55 Affairs shall use and expend the fund pursuant to subsection
- 56 (c). Any necessary expenses of the department in implementing



57 this section shall also be paid out of the fund.

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(c) (1) The Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs may make quarterly grants to any county in which the sheriff has provided the required reports as set out in the Minimum Accounting Requirements for the Office of Sheriff established by the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts, specifically regarding the number of pistol permits purchased in that county and the revenue received from pistol permit fees issued pursuant to Section 13A-11-75, for fiscal years 2022 and 2023. Any reports that are required by this act and delinquent on the effective date of this act shall be accepted as timely if delivered within 90 days of the effective date of this act. Any grants awarded to a county pursuant to this subsection may not exceed the amount of revenue received from pistol permit fees by that county in fiscal year 20222021, as indicated within the reports to the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts. Any amounts exceeding these revenues shall be remitted back to the Local Covernment Pistol Permit Revenue Loss Fund Sheriffs' Advancement in Education, Technology, and Training Fund at the end of each fiscal year. Grant funds Monies shall be used by a county only for the same purposes for which pistol permit fees were authorized to be expended within that county on January 1, 2023 December 31, 2022. (2) The Department of Economic and Community Affairs shall make grants under this subsection only to an office of sheriff that, at time of submission of a report to the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts pursuant to

subdivision (1), has certified in writing that each pistol



permit issued by that office of sheriff in the preceding
quarter was issued only following completion of a background
check through the National Instant Criminal Background Check
System (NICS) and that the office of sheriff, within the
preceding 12 months, has trained each employee, officer, or
agent involved in the issuance of pistol permits on how and
when to perform a NICS background check.

- (d) No later than January 15, 2023, and thereafter on a quarterly basis, the Department of Examiners of PublicAccounts shall provide all reports referenced in subsection(c) to the Department of Economic and Community Affairs.
- (e) This section shall be repealed January 1, 20272029. At that time, any monies remaining in the fund that are not committed for the purpose of this section shall be transferred to the State General Fund.
  - (f) No monies may be withdrawn or expended from the fund for any purpose unless the monies have been appropriated by the Legislature. Any monies appropriated shall be budgeted and allotted pursuant to the Budget Management Act in accordance with Article 4 of Chapter 4 of Title 41, and only in the amounts provided by the Legislature in the general appropriations act or other appropriations act, and only for the purposes of Act 2022-133.
  - (g) (1) Each county receiving grant funds monies

    pursuant to subsection (c) shall establish a separate fund in

    the county treasury to account for the grant funds and

    expenditure of the funds for the deposit of grant reimbursement

    monies.

113	(2) All monies received by a county commission pursuant
114	to this section shall be deposited, within 30 days of receipt
115	into the fund and shall be allocated in the same manner that
116	pistol permit revenues are allocated by law.
117	(3) A county commission shall not retain any portion of
118	monies received pursuant to this section beyond what is
119	authorized by law.
120	(4) All monies received pursuant to subsection (c)
121	shall be expended at the discretion of the sheriff as
122	authorized by law and pursuant to the limitations of
123	subsection (c).
124	(5) The county commission shall not be responsible for
125	the expenditure of any monies received pursuant to this
126	section."
127	Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately
128	following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its
129	otherwise becoming law.
