8	Relating to Morgan County; to amend Section
9	45-52-233.02, Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide for the
10	maintenance of abandoned and stolen personal property by the
11	sheriff; to add Sections 45-52-233.04 through 45-52-233.09,
12	inclusive, to the Code of Alabama 1975, to authorize the
13	sheriff to sell certain abandoned, stolen, and unclaimed
14	property at public auction; to provide for the auction and for
15	the disposition of proceeds; to authorize the sheriff to sell
16	or destroy certain, stolen, or unclaimed firearms; and to make
17	nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the existing
18	code language to current style.
19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
20	Section 1. Section 45-52-233.02, Code of Alabama 1975,
21	is amended to read as follows:
22	"§45-52-233.02
23	(a) The Sheriff of Morgan County is authorized to sell
24	at public auction, in the manner provided in this section,
25	abandoned and stolen personal property recovered by the
26	Sheriff's Department of Morgan County, which property has
27	remained unclaimed by the rightful owner thereof for a period
28	of six consecutive months.

29	(b) (a) The sheriff Sheriff of Morgan County shall keep
30	and maintain a permanent record of all abandoned and stolen
31	personal property recovered by the <u>department</u> <u>sheriff's</u>
32	office. which These records shall state the description of the
33	property, the date of recovery of the property, the serial or
34	other identifying number of the property $\underline{\hspace{0.1in}}$ and the place $\underline{\hspace{0.1in}}$
35	recovery of where the property was recovered. Such The records
36	shall be open to public inspection at all reasonable times.
37	(b) All abandoned or stolen property recovered by the
38	<pre>department sheriff's office shall be stored in a suitable</pre>
39	place to protect the <u>same</u> property from deterioration;
40	provided, that if the property be of a perishable nature,
41	after reasonable attempts have been made to locate and
42	identify the owner thereof, if such attempts be unsuccessful,
43	the same may be sold at once without notice in which case the
44	proceeds shall be held for a period of six months for the
45	account of the owner and if not called for within that period
46	of time, after deducting and paying all expenses incurred in
47	the recovery, storage, maintenance, and sale of such property,
48	shall be paid to the department.
49	(c) At least every six months, the sheriff shall sell
50	at public auction to the highest bidder for cash all abandoned
51	or stolen personal property which has been recovered by the
52	department and has remained unclaimed by the rightful owner
53	thereof after a period of six months. The sales are to be made
54	after notice thereof shall have been given by publication in a
55	newspaper of general circulation in Morgan County once a week
56	for two successive weeks or by posting such notice in a

57	conspicuous place at the Morgan County Courthouse for a period
58	of at least 20 days prior to sale. The notice shall contain
59	the place, date, and time of each auction and shall further
60	contain a description of each item of personal property to be
61	sold at the auction. If publication of the notice be made by
62	publication in the newspaper, the first notice shall run at
63	least 20 days prior to the auction.
64	(d) The owner of any abandoned or stolen personal
65	property recovered by the department may redeem the same at
66	any time prior to its sale by paying any reasonable expenses
67	incurred in the recovery of the property, its maintenance and
68	storage, and a pro rata share of the costs, if any, of
69	publication of notice of the sale of the property.
70	(e) Whenever any property is sold at public auction as
71	provided in this section, a notation in the storage record
72	book shall be made of the fact of the sale and of the amount
73	received for the property. All sales shall be cash. The person
74	making the sale shall have the right to reject any and all
75	bids if the amount bid be unreasonably low and shall have the
76	right to continue the sale from time to time if no bidders are
77	present.
78	(f) The proceeds from any auction conducted under the
79	authority of this section, after deducting and paying all
80	expenses incurred in the recovery, storage, maintenance, and
81	sale of property sold at the auction, shall be paid into the
82	office of the sheriff. "
83	Section 2. Section 45-52-233.04 through 45-52-233.09,
84	inclusive, are added to the Code of Alabama 1975, to read as

If abandoned or stolen personal property is of a perishable nature and reasonable attempts to locate and identify the owner of the property are unsuccessful, the property may be sold at once without notice. The sheriff shall attempt to obtain the best possible price for the property. The proceeds from the sale shall be held for a period of six months for the owner. During this period, the proceeds shall be paid to the owner upon demand, less any costs of recovery, storage, maintenance, and sale. If the proceeds are not claimed within six months, after deducting and paying all expenses incurred in the recovery, storage, maintenance, and sale of such property, the net funds shall be paid to the Sheriff of Morgan County.

- (a) (1) The sheriff shall keep and maintain a permanent record of all abandoned or stolen firearms not subject to disposition by general law. The records shall state the description of the firearm, the date of recovery of the firearm, the serial or other identifying number, if any, of the firearm, and the place where the firearm was recovered.
- 107 (2) For the purposes of this act, "firearm" shall have
 108 the same meaning as defined in Section 13A-8-1 of the Code of
 109 Alabama 1975.
- 110 (b) Unless otherwise provided by law, the sheriff may
 111 sell or destroy the firearm if the owner of the firearm does
 112 not claim the firearm within six months of the date the



- 113 sheriff obtained it.
- (c) The sheriff may sell the firearms only to gun 114 115 dealers who have a current federal firearm license on the date 116 of the sale. The sheriff shall establish a procedure to notify 117 qun dealers of a sale. A firearm shall be sold to the qun 118 dealer submitting the highest sealed bid. All sales shall be 119 on a cash basis. The proceeds of the sale, after deducting and 120 paying all expenses incurred in the recovery, maintenance, and 121 sale of the firearms shall be paid to the office of the
- 123 (d) The sheriff may establish a procedure to destroy
 124 firearms and may expend necessary funds of the sheriff's
 125 office for that purpose.

- 127 (a) As often as necessary, the sheriff may sell at
 128 public auction or by internet auction to the highest bidder
 129 all abandoned or stolen personal property, other than
 130 firearms, which has been recovered by the sheriff's office and
 131 has remained unclaimed by the rightful owner for at least a
 132 six-month period.
- 133 (b) Prior to the sale, notice shall be given by 134 publication in a newspaper of general circulation in Morgan 135 County once a week for two successive weeks or by posting 136 notice in a conspicuous place at the Morgan County Courthouse 137 for a period of at least 20 days. The notice shall contain the 138 place, date, and time of each auction and a general description of items of personal property to be sold at the 139 140 auction. If the publication of notice is made in the

- newspaper, the first notice shall run at least 20 days prior to the auction.

- 144 The owner of any abandoned or stolen personal property recovered by the Morgan County Sheriff's Office, including 145 146 firearms, may claim the property at any time prior to its sale 147 by submitting sufficient proof of ownership as determined by the sheriff and paying any reasonable expenses incurred in the 148 recovery of the property, its maintenance, storage, and a pro 149 rata share of the cost, if any, of publication of notice of 150 151 the sale of the property.

- 153 If the property is sold at public auction, as provided
 154 in this act, a notation in the storage record shall be made of
 155 the sale and of the amount received for the property. The
 156 person making the sale may reject any and all bids if the
 157 amount bid is unreasonably low and may continue the sale, from
 158 time to time, if no bidders are present.

- 160 The proceeds from the sale of the property at an 161 auction conducted under the authority of this act, after 162 deducting and paying all expenses incurred in the recovery, 163 storage, maintenance, and sale of property, shall be collected 164 by the sheriff and deposited in any bank located in Morgan County into a fund designated as the sheriff's fund. The fund 165 166 may be drawn upon by the sheriff and used exclusively for law enforcement purposes in the discharge of the duties of the 167 168 sheriff's office at the discretion of the sheriff.
