1 Enrolled, An Act,

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- Relating to amusement rides and water slides; to impose
- 4 new safety requirements pertaining to the operation and
- 5 maintenance of amusement rides and water slides.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 7 Section 1. Unless inconsistent with any other provision
- 8 of this act, the following ASTM International standards are
- 9 adopted by reference:
- 10 (1) F770-22, Standard Practice for Ownership,
- 11 Operation, Maintenance, and Inspection of Amusement Rides and
- 12 Devices.
- 13 (2) F2376-22, Standard Practice for Classification,
- 14 Design, Manufacture, Construction, and Operation of Water
- 15 Slide Systems.
- 16 (3) F747-22, Standard Terminology Relating to Amusement
- 17 Rides and Devices.
- 18 Section 2. For the purposes of this act, the following
- 19 terms have the following meanings:
- 20 (1) AMUSEMENT RIDE. A device or combination of devices
- or elements that carry, convey, or direct an individual over
- 22 or through a fixed or restricted course or within a defined
- area for the primary purpose of amusement or entertainment,
- including, but not limited to, amusement railway rides,
- 25 circular rides, concession go karts, flat rides, high rides,
- 26 inflatable amusement devices, and kiddie rides as defined in
- 27 ASTM F747-22. Amusement rides shall not include aerial
- trekking courses, canopy tours, challenge courses, fun karts,



- 29 race karts, ropes courses, trampoline courts, or zip lines as
- defined in ASTM F747-22. Further, amusement rides shall not
- include coin-operated amusement rides, courses or facilities
- 32 that include whitewater rafting, paddling, climbing,
- 33 bouldering, or biking, or nonmechanized playground equipment.
- 34 (2) COIN-OPERATED AMUSEMENT RIDE. A single passenger
- 35 coin-operated ride that is manually, mechanically, or
- 36 electrically operated, customarily placed in a public
- 37 location, and does not normally require the supervision of an
- 38 operator.
- 39 (3) INFLATABLE AMUSEMENT DEVICE. An amusement ride or
- 40 device designed for uses including, but not limited to,
- 41 bouncing, climbing, sliding, or interactive play, made of
- flexible fabric, kept inflated by continuous air flow provided
- 43 by one or more blowers, and reliant upon air pressure to
- 44 maintain its shape. The term does not include mobile devices
- 45 that are offered for rent or sale to the general public.
- 46 (4) NONMECHANIZED PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT. Swings,
- 47 seesaws, stationary spring-mounted animal features,
- 48 rider-propelled merry-go-rounds, climbers, playground slides,
- 49 physical fitness devices, and other similar items.
- 50 (5) OPERATOR. An individual in direct control of the
- 51 starting, stopping, or speed of an amusement ride.
- 52 (6) OWNER. The individual, organization, or business
- 53 entity responsible for the maintenance and operation of an
- 54 amusement ride or water slide.
- 55 (7) QUALIFIED INSPECTOR. A professional engineer or
- inspector who is not employed by the owner and holds at a



- 57 minimum a level 1 inspector certification from Amusement
- 58 Industry Manufacturers and Suppliers International (AIMS
- 59 International) or the National Association of Amusement Ride
- 60 Safety Officials.
- 61 (8) WATER SLIDE. A ride intended for use by riders in
- bathing attire where the action of the ride involves possible
- or purposeful immersion of the rider's body in water, either
- 64 in whole or in part, and which uses circulating water to
- 65 mobilize or lubricate the rider's transportation along a
- 66 pre-built path. A water slide includes slides used with or
- 67 without vehicles, but does not include water slides installed
- at private residences, water flume amusement rides, log flume
- 69 rides, lazy river-type attractions operating at a constant
- 70 elevation and constructed in the ground, courses or facilities
- 71 that include whitewater rafting or paddling, or slides where
- 72 the change in elevation from the beginning to the end of the
- 73 slide is less than fifteen feet.
- 74 Section 3. (a) All amusement rides and water slides
- 75 shall be inspected by a qualified inspector at least once
- 76 every 12 months, measured from the date of issuance of the
- immediately preceding inspection certificate.
- 78 (b) Upon completion of a satisfactory inspection, a
- 79 qualified inspector shall issue an inspection certificate to
- 80 the owner of the amusement ride or water slide certifying
- 81 that, in the qualified inspector's reasonable judgment, the
- 82 amusement ride or water slide substantially complies with all
- 83 statutorily required ASTM standards and is reasonably safe for
- 84 public use.



85 (c) No patron may be admitted to an amusement ride or 86 water slide that has undergone a major modification until the 87 amusement ride or water slide receives a new inspection 88 certificate from a qualified inspector.

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- (d) (1) No amusement ride or water slide may be operated for the public if the amusement ride or water slide has not received an inspection certificate from a qualified inspector.
- (2) If, using his or her reasonable judgment, a qualified inspector determines that an amusement ride or water slide is not reasonably safe for public use, the qualified inspector shall immediately notify the amusement ride or water slide's owner of any unsafe condition.
- (3) A qualified inspector shall not issue an inspection certificate for an unsafe amusement ride or water slide until the unsafe condition has been rectified to the satisfaction of the qualified inspector.
- 101 (e) Inspection fees shall be determined by each
 102 qualified inspector and paid by the owner of the amusement
 103 ride or water slide.
- 104 (f) In addition to the inspections by qualified
 105 inspectors required by this act, the owner of an amusement
 106 ride shall ensure that, at minimum, a daily pre-opening
 107 inspection is conducted on each amusement ride and water slide
 108 in accordance with the pre-opening inspection requirements of
 109 ASTM F770-22, ASTM F1193-22 Section 6, or ASTM F2376-22.
- 110 (g) Owners shall keep records of all inspections by
 111 qualified inspectors and pre-opening inspections for at least
 112 three years from the creation of each record.

- Section 5. (a) Patrons of an amusement ride or water
- 126 slide shall do all of the following:
- 127 (1) Obey all posted signs, including, but not limited
- 128 to, warning signs, instruction signs, and direction signs,
- 129 pertaining to the amusement ride or water slide.
- (2) Obey all verbal instructions from operators.
- 131 (3) Properly use all safety equipment on the amusement
- 132 ride or water slide in accordance with the instructions of
- 133 operators and posted signs.
- 134 (b) Patrons of an amusement ride or water slide may not
- do any of the following:
- 136 (1) Act in any manner that may cause or contribute to
- injury to self or others.
- 138 (2) Interfere with the operation of the amusement ride
- 139 or water slide.
- 140 (3) Fail to engage any provided safety devices.



- 141 (4) Disconnect or disable a safety device, except at 142 the express instruction of an operator.
- 143 (5) Extend arms or legs beyond the carrier or seating 144 area, except at the express instruction of an operator.
- 145 (6) Throw, drop, or expel any object from or toward an amusement ride or water slide.
- 147 (7) Enter or exit an amusement ride or water slide,
 148 except at the designated time and area, at the express
 149 direction of an operator, or in an emergency.

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
- 150 (8) Unreasonably control the speed or direction of
 151 himself or herself if the amusement ride or water slide
 152 requires the patron to control or direct himself or herself.
 - (9) Ride any amusement ride or water slide while under the influence of alcohol or any other intoxicating substance.
- 155 (c) Any patron who violates the provisions of this
 156 section shall be subject to immediate removal from the
 157 amusement facility without the refund of any admission charge.

158 Section 6. This act shall not apply to sheriffs, 159 recreational vehicle parks, as defined in Section 35-15-30, 160 Code of Alabama 1975, governmental entities, or summer camps. 161 For the purposes of this act, "summer camps" include 162 facilities providing lodging, meals, and educational and recreational opportunities, primarily for the benefit of 163 164 children, students, and nonprofit organizations, and not 165 members of the general public. For purposes of this act, "governmental entities" shall mean the state or any political 166 subdivision thereof, or any department, agency, board, 167

commission, or authority of the state, or any such political



169	subdivision, or any public corporation, authority, agency,
170	board, commission, state colleges, or universities, or other
171	governmental entity controlled by the state or any such
172	political subdivisions. This definition shall be inclusive of
173	both the singular and plural form of this term.
174	Section 7. This act shall become effective on the first
175	day of the third month following its passage and approval by
176	the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
