5	This bill would provide requirements pertaining
6	to the operation and maintenance of amusement rides and
7	water slides relating to inspections, liability
8	insurance, and operator and patron conduct.

12	TO BE ENTITLED
13	AN ACT
14	
15	Relating to amusement rides and water slides; to impose
16	new safety requirements pertaining to the operation and
17	maintenance of amusement rides and water slides.
18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
19	Section 1. Unless inconsistent with any other provision
20	of this act, the following ASTM International standards are
21	adopted by reference:
22	(1) F770-22, Standard Practice for Ownership,
23	Operation, Maintenance, and Inspection of Amusement Rides and
24	Devices.
25	(2) F2376-22, Standard Practice for Classification,
26	Design, Manufacture, Construction, and Operation of Water
27	Slide Systems.
28	(3) F747-22, Standard Terminology Relating to Amusement

- 30 Section 2. For the purposes of this act, the following 31 terms have the following meanings:
- 32 (1) AMUSEMENT RIDE. A device or combination of devices 33 or elements that carry, convey, or direct an individual over 34 or through a fixed or restricted course or within a defined 35 area for the primary purpose of amusement or entertainment, 36 including, but not limited to, amusement railway rides, 37 circular rides, concession go karts, flat rides, high rides, inflatable amusement devices, and kiddie rides as defined in 38 39 ASTM F747-22. Amusement rides shall not include aerial trekking courses, canopy tours, challenge courses, fun karts, 40 41 race karts, ropes courses, trampoline courts, or zip lines as defined in ASTM F747-22. Further, amusement rides shall not 42 43 include coin-operated amusement rides or nonmechanized
 - (2) COIN-OPERATED AMUSEMENT RIDE. A single passenger coin-operated ride that is manually, mechanically, or electrically operated, customarily placed in a public location, and does not normally require the supervision of an operator.
- (3) INFLATABLE AMUSEMENT DEVICE. An amusement ride or device designed for uses including, but not limited to, bouncing, climbing, sliding, or interactive play, made of flexible fabric, kept inflated by continuous air flow provided by one or more blowers, and reliant upon air pressure to maintain its shape.
- 56 (4) NONMECHANIZED PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT. Swings,



- 57 seesaws, stationary spring-mounted animal features,
- rider-propelled merry-go-rounds, climbers, playground slides,
- 59 physical fitness devices, and other similar items.
- 60 (5) OPERATOR. An individual in direct control of the
- starting, stopping, or speed of an amusement ride.
- 62 (6) OWNER. The individual, organization, or business
- 63 entity responsible for the maintenance and operation of an
- 64 amusement ride or water slide.
- (7) QUALIFIED INSPECTOR. A professional engineer or
- inspector who is not employed by the owner and holds at a
- 67 minimum a level 1 maintenance certification from Amusement
- 68 Industry Manufacturers and Suppliers International (AIMS
- 69 International) or the National Association of Amusement Ride
- 70 Safety Officials.
- 71 (8) WATER SLIDE. A ride intended for use by riders in
- 72 bathing attire where the action of the ride involves possible
- or purposeful immersion of the rider's body in water, either
- in whole or in part, and which uses circulating water to
- 75 mobilize or lubricate the rider's transportation along a
- 76 pre-built path. A water slide includes slides used with or
- 77 without vehicles, but does not include water slides installed
- 78 at private residences, water flume amusement rides, log flume
- 79 rides, lazy river-type attractions operating at a constant
- 80 elevation and constructed in the ground, or slides where the
- 81 change in elevation from the beginning to the end of the slide
- 82 is less than fifteen feet.
- 83 Section 3. (a) All amusement rides and water slides
- 84 shall be inspected by a qualified inspector at least once



every 12 months, measured from the date of issuance of the immediately preceding inspection certificate.

- (b) Upon completion of a satisfactory inspection, a qualified inspector shall issue an inspection certificate to the owner of the amusement ride or water slide certifying that, in the qualified inspector's reasonable judgment, the amusement ride or water slide substantially complies with all statutorily required ASTM standards and is reasonably safe for public use.
 - (c) No patron may be admitted to an amusement ride or water slide that has undergone a major modification until the amusement ride or water slide receives a new inspection certificate from a qualified inspector.
- 98 (d)(1) No amusement ride or water slide may be operated 99 for the public if the amusement ride or water slide has not 100 received an inspection certificate from a qualified inspector.
- 101 (2) If, using his or her reasonable judgment, a
 102 qualified inspector determines that an amusement ride or water
 103 slide is not reasonably safe for public use, the qualified
 104 inspector shall immediately notify the amusement ride or water
 105 slide's owner of any unsafe condition.
- 106 (3) A qualified inspector shall not issue an inspection 107 certificate for an unsafe amusement ride or water slide until 108 the unsafe condition has been rectified to the satisfaction of 109 the qualified inspector.
- (e) Inspection fees shall be determined by each qualified inspector and paid by the owner of the amusement ride or water slide.



- 113 (f) In addition to the inspections by qualified

 114 inspectors required by this act, the owner of an amusement

 115 ride shall ensure that, at minimum, a daily pre-opening

 116 inspection is conducted on each amusement ride and water slide

 117 in accordance with the pre-opening inspection requirements of

 118 ASTM F770-22, ASTM F1193-22 Section 6, or ASTM F2376-22.
- 119 (g) Owners shall keep records of all inspections by
 120 qualified inspectors and pre-opening inspections for at least
 121 three years from the creation of each record.

122 Section 4. An owner of an amusement ride or water slide shall maintain, at all times during which the amusement ride 123 124 or water slide is in operation for the public, liability 125 insurance with an insurer authorized or approved to write such 126 insurance in this state on the operation of the amusement ride 127 or water slide providing coverage, subject to a limit, exclusive of interest and costs, of not less than five hundred 128 129 thousand dollars (\$500,000) for bodily injury or death of one 130 individual in each occurrence, and, subject to such limit for 131 one individual, to a limit of not less than one million 132 dollars (\$1,000,000) for bodily injury or death of two or more 133 individuals in each occurrence.


- Section 5. (a) Patrons of an amusement ride or water slide shall do all of the following:
- 136 (1) Obey all posted signs, including, but not limited 137 to, warning signs, instruction signs, and direction signs, 138 pertaining to the amusement ride or water slide.
- 139 (2) Obey all verbal instructions from operators.

(3) Properly use all safety equipment on the amusement



- ride or water slide in accordance with the instructions of operators and posted signs.
- 143 (b) Patrons of an amusement ride or water slide may not
 144 do any of the following:
- 145 (1) Act in any manner that may cause or contribute to injury to self or others.
- 147 (2) Interfere with the operation of the amusement ride 148 or water slide.
- 149 (3) Fail to engage any provided safety devices.
- 150 (4) Disconnect or disable a safety device, except at 151 the express instruction of an operator.
- 152 (5) Extend arms or legs beyond the carrier or seating 153 area, except at the express instruction of an operator.
- 154 (6) Throw, drop, or expel any object from or toward an amusement ride or water slide.
- 156 (7) Enter or exit an amusement ride or water slide,
 157 except at the designated time and area, at the express
 158 direction of an operator, or in an emergency.
- 159 (8) Unreasonably control the speed or direction of
 160 himself or herself if the amusement ride or water slide
 161 requires the patron to control or direct himself or herself.
- 162 (9) Ride any amusement ride or water slide while under 163 the influence of alcohol or any other intoxicating substance.
- 164 (c) Any patron who violates the provisions of this
 165 section shall be subject to immediate removal from the
 166 amusement facility without the refund of any admission charge.
- Section 6. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by





169 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
