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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	This bill would authorize a pharmacist to
6	decline to dispense a drug to a covered individual if
7	the pharmacist will be reimbursed for the drug in an
8	amount that is less than the pharmacist's cost to
9	acquire the drug.
10	This bill would also authorize a pharmacist to
11	discuss matters relating to a pharmacy claim with a
12	covered individual.
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15	A BILL
16	TO BE ENTITLED
17	AN ACT
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19	Relating to pharmacists; to amend Section 27-45A-7,
20	Code of Alabama 1975; to authorize a pharmacist to decline to
21	fill a prescription if the pharmacist will be reimbursed for
22	the drug in an amount that is less than the pharmacist's
23	acquisition cost; and to prohibit a pharmacist from being
24	restricted from discussing matters relating to a pharmacy
25	claim with a patient.
26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
27	Section 1. Section 27-45A-7, Code of Alabama 1975, is
28	amended to read as follows:

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29	"\$27-45A-7
30	Reserved. Notwithstanding any other provision of this
31	chapter, if a pharmacy benefits manager reimburses a pharmacy
32	or pharmacist at a cost below the pharmacy's acquisition cost
33	of a specific drug, a pharmacy or pharmacist may do either of
34	the following:
35	(1) Decline to provide dispensing services to the
36	covered individual for the drug and allow the individual to
37	seek the drug from another pharmacy.
38	(2) Discuss alternatives with the covered individual.
39	The pharmacist shall not be restricted when communicating with
40	a covered individual regarding a prescription being filled
41	regardless of payment type, including, but not limited to,
42	payment by cash, third party, insurance, or charity, or
43	through a workers' compensation claim. The pharmacist may
4 4	disclose any relevant information to the covered individual,
45	including cost, reimbursement, alternative therapy, or other
46	information deemed necessary by the professional judgment of
47	the pharmacist or needed to complete a business transaction."
48	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first
49	day of the third month following its passage and approval by
5.0	the Governor or its otherwise becoming law
