5	This bill would provide legislative findings

7	many rural hospitals at risk of shutting down
8	This bill would expand the Medicaid program to
9	provide assistance to all persons for whom matching
10	funds are available to the state under the Patient
11	Protection and Affordable Care Act.

15	TO BE ENTITLED
16	AN ACT
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18	Relating to Medicaid; to expand the program to provide
19	assistance to certain state residents; to direct the Alabama
20	Medicaid Agency to implement the expansion; to direct other
21	state agencies and entities to provide certain assistance; and
22	to provide for appropriations for adequate funding.
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. The Legislature finds all of the following:
25	(1) The question of how to provide comprehensive,
26	quality health care to all Alabamians regardless of income,
27	health status, age, or gender has been one the Alabama

Legislature has asked itself time and time again.

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- 29 (2) The residents of this state are suffering because 30 of their lack of access to adequate health care.
- 31 (3) The residents of Alabama have been hit hard, and it 32 is imperative that access to health care is expanded to ensure 33 the act of visiting a doctor does not result in financial 34 calamity for individuals or families.
- 35 (4) Reducing the number of uninsured patients will keep 36 hospitals open. Since 2011, 17 Alabama hospitals have closed, 88 percent of these remaining rural hospitals are operating in 37 the red, as well as 75 percent of all Alabama hospitals. 38 39 Research suggests that now that the federal government's COVID relief funding has ended, at least 15 additional rural 40
- hospitals in the state are at immediate risk of closure. These 42 hospitals depend on federal dollars to offset the cost of 43 serving a high proportion of low-income and uninsured 44 patients.

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- (5) Broad access to health care leads to preventive care, which produces healthier families, a healthier workforce, and an all-around healthier state.
- (6) With the expansion of Medicaid, approximately 397,000 uninsured Alabamians would be eligible to receive low-cost health insurance with a majority of these residents being employed. Research has shown that in states that have expanded Medicaid, expansion has improved workforce participation by making it easier for people to work, including to seek work or to continue working. Covering low-income adults would also reduce the burden of medical debt, currently the leading cause of personal bankruptcy.

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57 (7) Expansion of Medicaid will result in reduced state 58 spending on health care related services to those previously 59 uninsured residents with incomes below 133 percent of the 60 federal poverty level.

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- (8) Expansion of Medicaid will also increase coverage and access to health care for our veteran population to support and supplement the cost for their medical and mental health needs.
- (9) In addition to enhancing access to health care, expansion of Medicaid would promote revenue and economic activity in this state, resulting in the preservation and creation of jobs.
- (10) The Public Affairs Research Council of Alabama
 (PARCA) released a report in 2022 that found that expanding
 Medicaid coverage in Alabama could save the state almost \$400
 million per year more than enough to cover the cost of
 expansion and have an average positive economic impact of
 \$1.89 billion per year over that same time frame.
- 75 (11) Studies have shown that a one dollar (\$1) increase 76 in federal spending on Medicaid yields an additional 65 to 75 77 cents of economic activity.
- 78 (12) The Alabama Health Care Improvement Task Force,
 79 created on April 6, 2015, by Executive Order No. 4,
 80 unanimously recommended to the Governor to close Alabama's
 81 health coverage gap, which the expansion of Medicaid would
 82 achieve.
- Section 2. (a) The Medicaid program shall provide
 assistance to all persons who apply for and are determined to

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be eligible for assistance and for whom federal matching funds are available to the state under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Public Law 111-148, March 23, 2010, as amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act 4 of 2010, Public Law 111-152, March 30, 2010.

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- (b) The Alabama Medicaid Agency shall take all steps necessary to implement the Medicaid expansion program as provided for in subsection (a) and shall be the lead agency for the implementation in this state. The Alabama Medicaid Agency shall seek assistance from any state or federal agencies or entities to implement the program as appropriate, and all state agencies and entities shall provide assistance as requested by the agency.
- (c) The Legislature shall annually appropriate adequate funding to the Alabama Medicaid Agency for the purpose of implementing and operating the Medicaid expansion program pursuant to this section.
- Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
