5	This bill would create the What is a Woman Act
6	and provide legislative findings relating to the
7	distinctions between men and women.
8	This bill would define man, woman, boy, girl,
9	father, mother, male, female, and sex for purposes of
10	use of the terms in the Code of Alabama 1975.
11	This bill would require the state or political
12	subdivisions that collect vital statistics for certain
13	purposes to identify each individual as either male of
14	female at birth.
15	This bill would also delete obsolete or
16	unnecessary definitions and make nonsubstantive,
17	technical revisions to update the existing code
18	language to current style.

- 32 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 33 Section 1. This act shall be known as the What Is A
- 34 Woman Act.
- 35 Section 2. (a) The Legislature finds and declares all
- 36 of the following:
- 37 (1) For purposes of state law, an individual's "sex" is
- defined as his or her biological sex, either male or female,
- 39 at birth.
- 40 (2) For purposes of state law, a "female" is an
- 41 individual whose biological reproductive system is designed to
- 42 produce ova, and a "male" is an individual whose biological
- 43 reproductive system is designed to fertilize the ova of a
- 44 female.
- 45 (3) For purposes of state law, "woman" and "girl" refer
- 46 to human females, and the terms "man" and "boy" refer to human
- 47 males.
- 48 (4) For purposes of state law, "mother" is defined as a
- 49 parent that is of the female sex, and the term "father" is
- defined as a parent that is of the male sex.
- 51 (5) When it comes to sex, "equal" does not mean "same"
- 52 or "identical."
- 53 (6) When it comes to sex, "separate" is not inherently
- 54 unequal.
- 55 (7) An individual born with a medically verifiable
- diagnosis of "disorder or difference in sex development" shall



- 57 be provided legal protections and accomodations afforded under 58 the federal Americans with Disabilities Act.
- (8) Notwithstanding any state law to the contrary,
 there are legitimate reasons to distinguish between the sexes
 with respect to athletics, prisons or other detention
 facilities, domestic violence shelters, rape crisis centers,
 locker rooms, bathrooms, and other areas where biology,
 safety, or privacy are implicated.
 - (9) Polices and laws that distinguish between the sexes are subject to intermediate constitutional scrutiny, which forbids unfair discrimination against similarly-situated males and females but allows the law to distinguish between the sexes where such distinctions are substantially related to important governmental objectives.

Section 3. Any school district or public school, and any state agency, department, bureau, or commission, or political subdivision that collects vital statistics for the purpose of complying with anti-discrimination laws or for the purpose of gathering accurate public health, crime, economic, or other data shall identify each individual who is part of the collected data set as either male or female at birth.

Section 4. Nothing in Sections 2 or 3 shall be construed to prohibit the state or any political subdivision of the state from complying with federal laws or regulations or other requirements governing federal grants or funding.

Section 5. Section 1-1-1, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

146	Section 6. This act shall become effective on the first
147	day of the third month following its passage and approval by
148	the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
