- a. The An employee is working within the scope of his or her employment as a server or a busser.
- b. The A restaurant employee may not work as a bartender and may not pour or dispense alcoholic beverages.
- c. The restaurant licensee is annually certified as a responsible vendor under the Alabama Responsible Vendor Act as provided in Chapter 10.
 - (2) An individual under 21 years of age and who is employed by a wholesale licensee or an off-premises retail licensee may handle, transport, or sell alcoholic beverages, provided the employee is working within the scope of his or her employment.
