SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, election inspectors and clerks are entitled to a base compensation of \$50 dollars.

Also under existing law, election inspectors are entitled to supplemental compensation in an amount to ensure that each inspector is compensated in an amount of at least \$100 per day and election clerks are entitled to supplemental compensation in an amount to ensure that each clerk is compensated in an amount of at least \$75 per day.

This bill would increase the supplemental compensation paid to election inspectors and clerks.

Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds

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29 within the meaning of the amendment. If this bill is 30 not enacted by a 2/3 vote, it will not become effective 31 with regard to a local entity unless approved by the 32 local entity or until, and only as long as, the 33 Legislature appropriates funds or provides for a local source of revenue. 34 35 36 37 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 38 39 AN ACT 40 Relating to elections; to amend Section 17-8-12, Code 41 42 of Alabama 1975, to increase the supplemental compensation 43 paid to election inspectors and clerks; and in connection 44 therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement 45 of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the 46 meaning of Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 47 2022. 48 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 49 Section 1. Section 17-8-12, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows: 50 51 "\$17-8-12 52 (a) The inspector and clerks shall each be entitled to base compensation of fifty dollars (\$50). The compensation of 53 the election officials shall be paid as preferred claims, out 54 of monies in the county treasury not appropriated, on proper 55 56 proof of service rendered. In all counties in which the

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compensation of precinct election officials is prescribed by local law or general law of local application at an amount in excess of the amount prescribed, the compensation of the precinct election officials shall not be decreased under this section and the county commission may increase the compensation so prescribed. In those counties in which compensation of precinct election officials is set at an amount in excess of five dollars (\$5) per day, but less than fifty dollars (\$50) per day, the provision of the local law or general law of local application relative thereto is superseded and the compensation prescribed herein shall be the total compensation of precinct election officials in the counties.

(b) In addition to the compensation provided in subsection (a), each clerk shall be entitled to supplemental compensation paid by the state to ensure that the total compensation paid to each shall be in an amount of at least seventy-five dollars (\$75) one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125) per day, and each inspector shall be entitled to supplemental compensation paid by the state in an amount that ensures that the total compensation of an inspector is at least one hundred fifty dollars (\$100) (\$150) per day. Upon completion of a local election school or being certified as a qualified precinct election official by the judge of probate, or both, each clerk and inspector shall be entitled to receive an additional twenty-five dollars (\$25) per day in compensation from the state. The increase provided for in this subsection shall not increase or decrease any salary



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85 supplement paid under a local law which is in effect on 86 October 1, 2005October 1, 2022. This subsection shall only 87 apply to those statewide elections for which county expenses 88 are reimbursed by the state as defined in Chapter 16. This 89 subsection shall not apply to special county or other elections held at any time other than at the time of holding 90 91 statewide elections." 92 Section 2. The purpose or effect of this bill would be 93 to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Section 111.05 of the Constitution of 94 95 Alabama of 2022. If this bill is not enacted by a 2/3 vote, it will not become effective with regard to a local entity unless 96 97 approved by the local entity or until, and only as long as, 98 the Legislature appropriates funds or provides for a local 99 source of revenue. Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first 100 101 day of the third month following its passage and approval by 102 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
