4 SYNOPSIS:

United States Navy, United States Marine Corps, United States Air Force, United States Coast Guard, and United States Space Force are collectively referred to as the United States Armed Forces.

Also, under existing law, the United States

Armed Forces, along with the Public Health Service

Commissioned Corps and the National Oceanic and

Atmospheric Administration Commissioned Officer Corps,

are collectively referred to as the United States

Uniformed Services.

This bill would create the Troy Act.

This bill would provide that all references to the United States Uniformed Services in the Code of Alabama 1975, and other state law, shall include the Public Health Service Commissioned Corps and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration Commissioned Officer Corps.

This bill would also direct the Code

Commissioner to make conforming changes to the Code of

Alabama 1975, as appropriate.

- 48 (a) The United States has eight uniformed federal services that commission officers under Title 10 of the United 49
- 50 States Code, consisting of the six Armed Forces of the United
- 51 States (United States Army, United States Navy, United States

- 53 Guard, and the United States Space Force) along with the
- 54 Public Health Service Commissioned Corps and the National

57	(b) Officers of the Public Health Service Commissioned
58	Corps and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration
59	Commissioned Officer Corps have uniforms, service insignia,
60	and commissioning devices comparable to the United States
61	Armed Forces, may be militarized by the President, and can be
62	classified as prisoners of war if captured by a belligerent
63	entity. They are paid on the same scale as members of the
64	United States Armed Forces, with respective rank and
65	time-in-grade.
66	(c) All verbal and written collective references to the
67	United States Uniformed Services shall include the Public
68	Health Service Commissioned Corps and the National Oceanic and

70	Section 3. The Code Commissioner shall change all
