20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the Opioid
22	Treatment and Abatement Fund the sum of \$10,000,000 for the
23	fiscal year ending September 30, 2023, to the entities and for
24	the purposes specified herein.

(1) To the Department of Corrections for opioid and co-occurring substance abuse treatment, including Residential Substance Abuse treatment, FDA-approved medication, and pre and post-release services to justice-involved individuals,
