1 Enrolled, An Act, 2 3 4 RECOGNIZING MEMORIAL DAY AND HONORING THE 5 COURAGEOUS PATRIOTS WHO HAVE FOUGHT FOR THE UNITED STATES OF 6 AMERICA. 7 8 WHEREAS, with great pride and very special pleasure, we recognize Memorial Day and highly honor every patriot who 9 10 has bravely fought for the United States of America; and WHEREAS, in his 2004 proclamation, former President 11 12 George W. Bush stated, "For more than two centuries, 13 Americans have been called to defend the founding ideals of our democracy. On this year's Memorial Day, a grateful 14 15 Nation remembers the proud patriots who made the ultimate sacrifice in defense of liberty's blessings. From the 16 17 opening battles of the American Revolution through the 18 turmoil of the Civil War, to World War I, World War II, 19 Korea, and Vietnam, to the Persian Gulf and today's 20 operations in the War on Terror in Afghanistan, Iraq, and 21 around the world, the members of our military have built a 22 tradition of honorable and faithful service. As we observe 23 Memorial Day, we remember the more than one million 24 Americans who have died to preserve our freedom, the more 25 than 140,000 citizens who were prisoners of war, and all 26 those who were declared missing in action. We also honor our 27 veterans for their dedication to America and their sacrifice. In a radio address on June 6, 1944, President 28

29 Franklin Roosevelt described these service members as the 30 'pride of our Nation,' who struggled to preserve our civilization. The fallen from that fateful day and that war 31 32 will always be remembered. They hold a cherished place in 33 the history of the United States and in the memories of the people they liberated. Today, all who wear the uniform of 34 35 the United States are serving at a crucial hour in history, 36 and each has answered a great call to serve our Nation on 37 the front lines of freedom. As we continue to fight 38 terrorism and promote peace and freedom, let us pray for the safety and strength of our troops, for God's blessing on 39 them and their families, and for those who have lost loved 40 41 ones. On this Memorial Day, we honor all of our fallen 42 soldiers, their commitment to our country, and their legacy 43 of patriotism and sacrifice. By giving their lives in the cause of freedom, these heroes have protected and inspired 44 45 all Americans. In respect for their devotion to America, the 46 Congress, by a joint resolution approved on May 11, 1950, as amended (64 Stat. 158), has requested the President to issue 47 a proclamation calling on the people of the United States to 48 49 observe each Memorial Day as a day of prayer for permanent 50 peace and designating a period on that day when the people of the United States might unite in prayer; The Congress, by 51 52 Public Law 106-579, has also designated the minute beginning 53 at 3:00 p.m. local time on that day as a time for all Americans to observe the National Moment of Remembrance.
