10	WHEREAS, in his 2004 proclamation, former President
11	George W. Bush stated, "For more than two centuries,
12	Americans have been called to defend the founding ideals of
13	our democracy. On this year's Memorial Day, a grateful
14	Nation remembers the proud patriots who made the ultimate
15	sacrifice in defense of liberty's blessings. From the
16	opening battles of the American Revolution through the
17	turmoil of the Civil War, to World War I, World War II,
18	Korea, and Vietnam, to the Persian Gulf and today's
