WHEREAS, Chief Warrant Officer Three Danny Randolph and Chief Warrant Officer Three Daniel Wadham made the ultimate sacrifice for their country on February 15, 2023, while conducting a routine training flight with the Tennessee Army National Guard; the accident occurred on Alabama Highway 53 at mile marker 327.9; and

26 1-230th Assault Helicopter Battalion, which is stationed at 27 Berry Field Air National Guard Base in Nashville; and WHEREAS, Chief Warrant Officer Three Danny Randolph 28 29 had served in the military for 13 years, including a 30 deployment in Afghanistan, where he served as an air traffic 31 controller; a 2000 graduate of Gallatin High School, Chief Warrant Officer Three Danny Randolph was a loving husband 32 and father of four children and three stepchildren; and 33

34 WHEREAS, Chief Warrant Officer Three Daniel Wadham had 35 served in the military for 15 years; he leaves behind his 36 loving wife, Rosetta Wadham, who is a member of E Company, 37 1-230th, Tennessee Army National Guard, and their two 38 children, Lilly and Scarlett; and

39 WHEREAS, Chief Warrant Officer Three Danny Randolph's and Chief Warrant Officer Three Daniel Wadham's dedication 40 41 to excellence in the military and their love of family, 42 their fellow soldiers, and their country are exemplified in their sacrifice of life itself in defense of all that they 43 44 held dear and stand as enduring examples of the characteristics that have ensured the continued freedom of 45 46 our nation and the preservation of its ideals over the course of our history; and 47
