7	WHEREAS, the University of South Alabama was
8	chartered by Legislative Act on May 3, 1963, following the
9	efforts of local leaders, acting as the Mobile County
10	Foundation for Public Higher Education, who saw a great need
11	for a four-year, degree-granting institution along the
12	fast-growing Alabama Gulf Coast; and
13	WHEREAS, the university's first classes were held on
14	June 8, 1964, on a new suburban campus in West Mobile, with
15	276 students and Dr. Frederick P. Whiddon as its first
16	President; and
17	WHEREAS, the University of South Alabama has greatly
18	prospered and expanded in the past 60 years and today has
19	nearly 13,500 students and offers more than 125 academic
20	programs in 10 colleges and schools; and
21	WHEREAS, the university offerings include programs in
22	medicine, nursing, and allied health with one of only two
23	allopathic medical schools in the state and Alabama's
24	largest nursing college; a burgeoning School of Marine and
25	Environmental Sciences adjacent to the Mobile-Tensas Delta
26	and the Gulf of Mexico; the only comprehensive College of
27	Engineering in the state within 200 miles, and programs in

business, computing, education, science, and humanities; and

29	WHEREAS, the university boasts a 17 to 1 student to
30	faculty ratio, with 75 percent of instruction delivered by
31	full-time faculty, and a growing research portfolio with an
32	emphasis on health care and STEM exploration; and
33	WHEREAS, the university's early adoption of Mobile
34	General Hospital and creation of a medical school grew into
35	what is today USA Health, the region's only academic health
36	care system that includes USA Health University Hospital,
37	USA Health Children's and Women's Hospital, USA Health
38	Mitchell Cancer Institute, and an expanding line of primary
39	and specialty care clinics, in addition to safety net
40	services, including the area's only Level I trauma center,
41	USA Health Fanny Meisler Trauma Center, the Arnold Luterman
42	Regional Burn Center, a comprehensive stroke center, the
43	Level III Hollis J. Wiseman Neonatal Intensive Care Unit,
