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4 HR____ COMMENDING RANDY OWEN FOR SERVICE TO THE STATE OF 5 ALABAMA.

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7 WHEREAS, with special pleasure and great pride, we 8 honor and commend Randy Owen for his work and dedication to 9 making the lives of others better, especially those in the 10 State of Alabama, through music and philanthropy; and

11 WHEREAS, Alabama's favorite son, Randy Owen, was born 12 in Fort Payne on December 13, 1949, and from a young age, he 13 lived and worked on his family farm on Lookout Mountain, 14 which he still owns and works; and

WHEREAS, after high school graduation, Randy attended 15 and graduated from Jacksonville State University with a 16 17 degree in English; he proudly serves Jacksonville State University as a member of the Board of Trustees; he assisted 18 19 with the completion of the university's Little River Canyon Center, a green facility that houses the Little River Field 20 21 School and the National Park Service; in late 2023, there 22 will be a groundbreaking ceremony on a new performing arts facility that will bear his name, the Randy Owen Performing 23 24 Arts Center, which will have space for a recital hall, 25 recording studio, classrooms, support spaces, administrative offices, and a concert hall that seats 1,000; and 26

27 WHEREAS, as a member of the most successful country 28 band in music history, Alabama, Randy Owen has used his fame

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to serve others; he is the founder of Country Cares for St. 29 30 Jude Kids, which has raised more than \$800 million for cancer research; his band, Alabama, founded June Jam in 1982 31 32 to raise money for charity and has attracted the biggest 33 names in country music to perform at the festival, which has been brought back this year after a 26-year hiatus; the June 34 35 Jam Foundation has raised over \$15 million for various 36 charities; he also supports Alabama Sheriffs Boys Ranch 37 summer camps and raises money for relief from severe weather 38 events, including tornadoes and hurricanes that have devastated Alabama communities; and 39

WHEREAS, Randy uses his influence for important public issues, having recorded public service commercials supporting Amendment 1 on the May 24, 2022, primary ballot that supports Alabama State Parks; and he urged Alabama residents to participate in the 2020 Federal Census so that our state could benefit from the funding that an accurate census could provide; and

47 WHEREAS, the music industry's leading foundation that funds innovative cancer research for a cure, the T.J. 48 49 Martell Foundation, recognized the members of Alabama for 50 their own charitable works for cancer research by bestowing the Tony Martell Lifetime Entertainment Achievement Award in 51 52 2018; some of the many acknowledgments and honors that Randy 53 Owen has been awarded include the Country Music Association Foundation Humanitarian of the Year Award in 2019; the 54 55 prestigious Ellis Island Medal of Honor in 2008; for his continued support, St. Jude presented him with the Michael 56



57 F. Tamer Award; and

58 WHEREAS, Randy married his wife, Kelly, in 1975, and 59 their union was blessed with three children; now therefore, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 60 LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That we highly honor Randy Owen for 61 62 his compassionate support of his community, his state, and 63 his country through his many charitable works, and this resolution is proudly offered to him as evidence of our high 64 esteem and with best wishes for continued prosperity. 65
