HR\_\_\_\_\_ ENCOURAGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS AND NATIONAL 4 SECURITY COUNCIL TO FORMALLY REVIEW THE "STATUS OF FORCES 5 6 AGREEMENT" BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND JAPAN; TO 7 OFFICIALLY EXAMINE THE CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THE INVESTIGATION AND TRIAL OF NAVY LIEUTENANT RIDGE ALKONIS; 8 AND TO ENSURE THAT AMERICAN SERVICE MEMBERS ARE BEING 9 10 PROPERLY TREATED AND ADEQUATELY PROTECTED WHILE SERVING IN 11 JAPAN.

WHEREAS, there are over 100,000 American service members and dependents stationed in Japan, more than any other place in the world other than the United States; and WHEREAS, active-duty Alabamians are, and will continue to be, stationed abroad in Japan while serving in the United States Armed Forces; and

19 WHEREAS, Status of Forces Agreements are designed to 20 ensure adequate and fair legal treatment of American service 21 members stationed abroad; and

22 WHEREAS, in practice, the United States-Japan Status of 23 Forces Agreement does not appear to provide adequate legal 24 protection for American service members; as there are 25 reports that Japan regularly violates the Status of Forces

26 Agreement by detaining American service members without 27 adequate cause or necessity prior to charges; and 28 WHEREAS, there are reports that Japanese authorities 29 consistently deny legal counsel to service members during 30 police interrogations and fail to provide adequate 31 translation assistance during interrogations and trials, which violates U.S. Department of Defense policy regarding 32 the legal rights of service members overseas as outlined in 33 Secretary of the Navy Instruction 5820.4G and Army 34 35 Regulation 27-50; and 36 WHEREAS, the case of Navy Lieutenant Ridge Alkonis 37 embodies the reported issues surrounding the United 38 States-Japan Status of Forces Agreement, as Lieutenant 39 Alkonis experienced prejudicial treatment during Japanese police detainment and trial; and 40 41 WHEREAS, there are numerous reports of Lieutenant 42 Alkonis receiving extremely suspect legal advice and 43 inadequate support from United States Navy personnel during 44 legal proceedings; and WHEREAS, there is evidence of the United States Navy 45 46 knowingly misleading members of the United States Congress regarding Lieutenant Alkonis's case; and 47 WHEREAS, there is sufficient evidence to reasonably 48

49 suspect that Lieutenant Alkonis is wrongfully detained; and 50 WHEREAS, the United States Congress through the United

51 States House Committee on Armed Services is responsible for 52 conducting oversight of the United States Navy and ensuring 53 that international agreements are in the best interests of 54 the American people and abided to by the parties entered 55 therein; now therefore,

56 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 57 LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That we encourage the United States 58 Congress and the National Security Council to:

(a) Conduct a formal review of the Status of Forces Agreement between the United States and Japan to ensure that the agreement is in the best interest of the United States and adequately protects American service members in accordance with constitutional rights and United States Department of Defense policy; and

(b) Conduct an official investigation into the
circumstances and dealings surrounding the investigation,
trial, and conviction of Navy Lieutenant Ridge Alkonis to
ensure that Lieutenant Alkonis was treated fairly by Japan
and that the United States Navy provided fair and adequate
support; and

(c) Refer Lieutenant Ridge Alkonis's case to the
Special Presidential Envoy for Hostage Affairs to be
designated as a wrongfully detained case.
