To make appropriations for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other functions of government, for debt service, and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated from the named funds for the 2024 fiscal year to the state agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of



- 28 the Alabama Statutes.
- For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for
- 30 expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals
- 31 for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is
- 32 intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in
- 33 the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the
- 34 following definitions shall be applicable.
- 35 "Total" shall mean the aggregate total appropriation of
- 36 all funding sources.
- 37 "Program" shall mean specific governmental services
- 38 required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be
- 39 directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or
- 40 group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended
- 41 only for such purposes.
- "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which result
- 43 in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as land or
- 44 buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable period of
- 45 usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be expended only
- 46 for such purposes.
- "Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the
- 48 payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations
- of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.
- "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts, grants,
- 51 contributions, or entitlements, including grants by the
- 52 Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.
- 53 Section 2. (a) There is hereby appropriated the amounts
- set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive,



- 55 legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other functions of government, for debt service, and for capital 56 57 outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, to be 58 paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such other 59 funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be expended for the 60 61 items for which the appropriation is herein made shall not 62 exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the 63 Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 through 64 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, however, that regardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been 65 66 or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of 67 salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be made from the fiscal year's appropriation in which the pay 68 69 date falls.
- 70 (b) All appropriations made in Section 3 shall be at
  71 the program level. Any directed expenditure of funds below a
  72 program shall be from funds appropriated for the program.

In addition to the above appropriation herein made, there is hereby appropriated for each additional retail and wholesale store that is relocated or put into operation during the fiscal year, an amount equal to the sum required to install and operate a comparable store in operation by said Board. There is further appropriated to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, after provision has been made for the other expenditures herein authorized, such sums as are or may be necessary to purchase the alcoholic beverages which are essential to maintain adequate stocks and inventory for an economic and successful sales operation. In addition to the above appropriation, it is further provided that, in the event any county or municipality of the state shall, during the fiscal period covered by this appropriation by proper referendum, authorize the legal sale of malt and brewed beverages within such county or municipality there is further appropriated, in addition to the amount herein set out, an amount comparable to that expended during the prior fiscal year for beer and license tax supervision within counties or municipalities of similar size and population. Provided further, that the amount appropriated herein shall be reduced in like manner in the event any county or municipality wherein malt and brewed beverages are now authorized by law to be sold shall, during the fiscal period covered by this appropriation by proper referendum, declare unlawful the sale in such county or municipality of such malt or brewed beverages. Notwithstanding any other laws to the contrary, all revenue generated from bailment fees shall remain with the Board to be used for its operations.

The Director of the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs shall report to the Chairs of the House Ways and Means-General Fund Committee and the Senate Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee and the Legislative Fiscal Officer all funds and grants expended specifically in areas with high unemployment and low personal income levels.
