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4 SYNOPSIS:

5 Under existing law, a child who is six years of 6 age on or before December 31 is entitled to admission 7 to the first grade in the public elementary schools, 8 and a child who is five years of age on or before 9 September 1 is entitled to admission to the local 10 public school kindergartens.

11 This bill would allow a child to be admitted to 12 the first grade as long as he or she has successfully 13 completed kindergarten and would allow a child who is 14 six years of age on or before December 31 to be 15 admitted to the first grade so long as he or she 16 demonstrates first grade readiness.

This bill would also provide for those circumstances where a child under five years of age on September 1 may be admitted to public kindergarten and where a child under six years of age on December 31 may be admitted to public school first grade.

22 Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 23 2022, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect 24 would be to require a new or increased expenditure of 25 local funds from becoming effective with regard to a 26 local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 27 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of 28 specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected

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29 entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or 30 provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for 31 the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

A BILL

TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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45 To amend Section 16-28-4, Code of Alabama 1975, 46 relating to the minimum age for attendance at public schools; 47 to require a child to complete kindergarten or demonstrate 48 first grade readiness before entering the first grade; to provide for circumstances under which a child who is under 49 50 five years of age on September 1 may be admitted to public 51 kindergarten; to provide for circumstances under which a child 52 who is under six years of age on December 31 may be admitted 53 to public school first grade; and in connection therewith 54 would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of 55 Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022. 56



57 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

58 Section 1. Section 16-28-4 of the Code of Alabama 1975, 59 is amended to read as follows:

60 "\$16-28-4

61 (a) A child who is six five years of age on or before 62 December 31 September 1 or the date on which school begins in the enrolling district shall be entitled to admission to the 63 64 first grade kindergarten in the public elementary schools at 65 the opening of such schools for that school year or as soon as practicable thereafter. A child who is under six years of age 66 on December 31 or the date on which school begins in the 67 enrolling district shall not be entitled to admission to the 68 69 first grade in the public elementary schools during that school year; except, that an underage child who transfers from 70 71 the first grade of a school in another state may be admitted to school upon approval of the board of education in 72 73 authority, and an underage child who has moved into this state 74 having completed or graduated from a mandated kindergarten program in another state shall be entitled to admission to the 75 76 public elementary schools regardless of age. A child who 77 becomes six years of age on or before February 1 may, on approval of the local board of education, be admitted at the 78 79 beginning of the second semester of that school year to schools in school systems having semiannual promotions of 80 81 pupils. 82 (b) An underage child may be admitted to public kindergarten on approval of the local board of education, on a 83



85 circumstances:

86	(1) The underage child transfers from a public
87	kindergarten in another state.
88	(2) The child will become five years of age between
89	September 1 and December 31, and the child satisfies certain
90	criteria that the local board of education may establish for
91	underage enrollment which, if adopted, shall include the
92	successful completion of an assessment to determine
93	developmental readiness for enrollment.
94	(b)(c) A child who is five years of age on or before
95	September 1 or successfully completes kindergarten by the date
96	on which school begins in the enrolling district shall be
97	entitled to admission to the <u>first grade in the</u> local public
98	school <del>_kindergartens</del> at the opening of <del>_such</del> schools for that
99	school year or as soon as practicable thereafter <del>; a child who</del>
100	is under five years of age on September 1 or the date on which
101	school begins in the enrolling district shall not be entitled

103	that, an underage child who transfers from the public school
104	kindergarten in another state may be admitted to local public
105	kindergarten on the prior approval of the local board of

110	allowed admission to the first grade of the local public
111	schools.
112	(d) A child who is six years of age on or before



113	December 31, or the date on which school begins in the
114	enrolling district, and who has not successfully completed
115	kindergarten, shall be entitled to admission to the first
116	grade in the local public school at the opening of schools for
117	that school year or as soon as practicable thereafter, as long
118	as the child demonstrates first grade entry readiness, as
119	determined by the State Board of Education, on an assessment
120	of essential development and physical skills which shall be
121	created by the State Department of Education and approved by
122	the State Board of Education. The department shall publish
123	information about essential first grade readiness skills on
124	its website.
125	(e) An underage child, regardless of whether he or she
126	has successfully completed kindergarten or otherwise
127	demonstrates first grade readiness, may be admitted to the
128	public school first grade if the underage child transfers from
129	the first grade of a school in another state.
130	(f) Nothing in this section shall affect the
131	eligibility of students for special education services as
132	provided by federal and state law.

133 (c) (g) No public school system shall lose any teacher 134 unit as a result of this section. The State Board of Education 135 is authorized to adopt policies for local boards of education 136 for the implementation of this section."

Section 2. The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022. If this bill is not enacted by a 2/3 vote, it



141 will not become effective with regard to a local board of 142 education unless approved by the local board of education or 143 until, and only as long as, the Legislature appropriates funds 144 or provides for a local source of revenue.

145 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first 146 day of the third month following its passage and approval by 147 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
