20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. (a) As used in this section, the following

23	(1) HEALTH BENEFIT PLAN. Any individual or group plan,
24	policy, or contract for health care services, including a
25	vision or dental benefit plan issued, delivered, issued for
26	delivery, renewed in this state by a health care insurer,
27	health maintenance organization, accident and sickness

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## THE SERVICE

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- corporation, nonprofit medical service corporation, health
  care service plan, or any other individual, firm, corporation,
  joint venture, or other similar business entity that pays for,
  purchases, or furnishes health care services to patients,
  insureds, or beneficiaries in this state, including any entity
  created pursuant to Article 6 of Chapter 4 of Title 10, Code
  of Alabama 1975.
- 36 (2) PLAN SPONSOR. Any person who establishes, adopts,
  37 or maintains a health benefit plan, including an employer.

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- (b) A health benefit plan may provide all communications relating to a health benefit plan, including any health insurance identification card, to covered individuals of the health benefit plan by electronic means, provided the plan sponsor has done all of the following:
- (1) Confirmed that the enrollee routinely uses electronic communications on a regular basis. This may be confirmed by the employer of an enrollee if the employer is the plan sponsor.
- (2) Notified the enrollee of the electronic communication option and provided the enrollee with the opportunity to opt out of delivery by electronic communication.
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
