4 SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, a retiree receiving an Employees' Retirement System or Teachers' Retirement System allowance may perform duties with an employer participating in the system without suspension of the retirement allowance, provided the person is not employed in a permanent full-time capacity and the compensation does not exceed \$30,000 plus Consumer Price Index adjustments after 2017.

This bill would provide further for the compensation earned by retired law enforcement officers working as school resource officers for local boards of education.

- 32 (a) As used in this section, the following terms have 33 the following meanings:
- (1) RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER. A person who was a 34 35 law enforcement officer and retired in good standing from a 36 federal, state, or local law enforcement agency with at least 37
- (2) SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER. A person who is certified 38 39 by the Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission as a law enforcement officer, whose certification 40 is in good standing, and who has the power of arrest. 41
 - (b) A local board of education may employ persons as school security personnel or contract with a local chief of police or sheriff to employ school resource officers. A local board of education may allow any person employed by the board as school security personnel or as a school resource officer to carry a firearm while on duty if the employee satisfies all of the following qualifications:
- 49 (1) He or she is certified by the Alabama Peace 50 Officers' Standards and Training Commission as a law 51 enforcement officer whose certification is in good standing or 52 he or she is a retired law enforcement officer.
