4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, a pharmacist licensed by the
6	Alabama State Board of Pharmacy may administer
7	vaccines.
8	This bill would authorize a pharmacist to
9	prescribe those vaccines that he or she is otherwise
10	authorized to administer.
11	This bill would also require a pharmacist who
12	administers a vaccine to a minor to recommend annual
13	well-child visits with a pediatrician to that
14	individual or his or her caregiver.

21	Relating to the practice of pharmacy; to authorize a
22	licensed pharmacist to prescribe certain vaccines; and to
23	require pharmacists who administer vaccines to individuals
24	under 19 years of age to also recommend annual well-child
25	visits to a pediatrician.
26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
27	Section 1. (a) A pharmacist may order a prescription

for any of the following vaccines or immunizations:

- 29 (1) A seasonal influenza vaccine to an individual who 30 is two years of age or older.
- 31 (2) Any vaccine that the pharmacist is authorized by
 32 law to administer to an individual who is 19 years of age or
 33 older.
- 34 (3) Any vaccine to prevent COVID-19 to an individual who is three years of age or older.
- 36 (4) Any vaccine on the Center for Disease Control's
 37 Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices Immunization
 38 Schedules to an individual who is no younger than three years
 39 of age and no older than 18 years of age.
- 40 (b) When administering a vaccine to an individual who
 41 is no older than 18 years of age, the pharmacist shall discuss
 42 with the individual, or any adult accompanying the individual,
 43 the importance of an annual well-child appointment with a
 44 pediatrician or other primary care physician.
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
