4	SYNOPSIS:
5	This bill would propose an amendment to the
6	Constitution of Alabama of 2022, relating to public
7	K-12 schools, to require local boards of education to
8	adopt policies requiring each K-12 public school to
9	broadcast or sanction the performance of the first
10	stanza of The Star-Spangled Banner at least once per
11	week during school hours.

15	TO BE ENTITLED

18	Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama
19	of 2022, to require local boards of education to adopt
20	policies requiring each K-12 public school to broadcast or
21	sanction the performance of The Star-Spangled Banner at least
22	once per week during school hours.
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. The Legislature finds and declares the
25	following:
26	(1) During the Battle of Baltimore of the War of 1812

Francis Scott Key visited the British fleet in the Chesapeake
Bay on September 7, 1814, to secure the release of Dr. William

- 29 Beanes, who had been captured after the British burned
- 30 Washington, D.C.
- 31 (2) The release of Dr. Beanes was secured, but Key and
- 32 Beanes were held by the British during the shelling of Fort
- 33 McHenry, one of the forts defending Baltimore.
- 34 (3) On the morning of September 14, 1814, after the
- 35 25-hour British bombardment of Fort McHenry, Key peered
- 36 through the clearing smoke to see a 42-foot by 30-foot
- 37 American flag flying proudly atop the Fort.
- 38 (4) He was so inspired to see the enormous flag still
- 39 flying over the Fort that he began penning a song, which he
- 40 named The Defence of Fort McHenry, to commemorate the
- occasion, and he included a note that it should be sung to the
- 42 tune of the popular British melody To Anacreon in Heaven.
- 43 (5) In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson ordered that the
- 44 anthem, which had been popularly renamed The Star-Spangled
- 45 Banner, be played at military and naval occasions.
- 46 (6) On March 3, 1931, President Herbert Hoover signed a
- 47 resolution of Congress that officially designated The
- 48 Star-Spangled Banner as the National Anthem of the United
- 49 States.
- 50 (7) For over 100 years, The Star-Spangled Banner has
- 51 served to inspire generations of patriotic Americans, and it
- 52 is imperative that students have exposure to this history and
- 53 inspiration.
- 54 Section 2. The following amendment to the Constitution
- of Alabama of 2022, is proposed and shall become valid as a
- 56 part of the Constitution when approved by a majority of the



qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with

58 Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of

59 2022:

### PROPOSED AMENDMENT

- (a) Each local board of education shall adopt a policy requiring each public K-12 school under its jurisdiction to broadcast The Star-Spangled Banner during school hours, at least once per week. If not played or broadcast in a given week from Monday through Thursday, the Star-Spangled Banner shall be played or broadcast on Friday morning.
  - (b)(1) A local board of education shall select for broadcast, pursuant to subsection (a), any recording of the first stanza of The Star-Spangled Banner that is archived within the Library of Congress and available on the Library of Congress website.
  - (2) A local board of education, alternatively, may adopt a policy allowing, during school hours, for the performance of the first stanza of The Star-Spangled Banner from original sheet music, archived within the Library of Congress and available on its website, by a school-sanctioned band program, choral program, vocal group, or vocalist.

Upon ratification of this constitutional amendment, the Code Commissioner shall number and place this amendment as appropriate in the constitution omitting this instructional paragraph and may make the following nonsubstantive revisions: change capitalization, spelling, and punctuation for purposes of style and uniformity; correct manifest grammatical,

86	Section 3. An election upon the proposed amendment
87	shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the
88	Constitution of Alabama of 2022, and the election laws of this
89	state.
90	Section 4. The appropriate election official shall
91	assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional
92	amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the
93	following description of the substance or subject matter of
94	the proposed constitutional amendment:
95	"Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama
96	of 2022, to require local boards of education to adopt
97	policies requiring each K-12 public school to broadcast or
98	sanction the performance of the first stanza of The
99	Star-Spangled Banner at least once per week during school
100	hours.
101	Proposed by Act"
