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4 SYNOPSIS:

5 Under existing law, it unlawful for an 6 individual under 21 years of age to possess any 7 tobacco, tobacco product, alternative nicotine product, 8 or electronic nicotine delivery system, or false proof 9 of identification.

10 This bill would specify that an individual under 11 21 years of age commits a violation for the possession 12 of an electronic nicotine delivery system without 13 regard to whether the electronic nicotine delivery 14 system contained or was used in combination with an 15 e-liquid, a tobacco product, or other substance.

Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 16 17 2022, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect 18 would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a 19 20 local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 21 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of 22 specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected 23 entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or 24 provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for 25 the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill

30	entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective
31	because it comes within one of the specified exceptions

37	AN ACT
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39	Relating to vaping devices; to amend Section 28-11-14,
40	Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide prohibitions on the
41	possession of an electronic nicotine delivery system by
42	individuals under 21 years of age; and in connection therewith
43	would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new
44	or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of
45	Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.
46	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
47	Section 1. Section 28-11-13, Code of Alabama 1975, is
48	amended to read as follows:
49	"§28-11-13
50	(a) (1) It is unlawful for any individual under the age
51	of 21 years to purchase, use, possess, or transport tobacco, a
52	tobacco product, an electronic nicotine delivery system, or an
53	alternative nicotine product within this state.
54	(2) For purposes of the unlawful purchase, use,
55	possession, or transportation of an electronic nicotine
56	delivery system, a violation is committed upon mere possession

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57 of an electronic nicotine delivery system, regardless of 58 whether the electronic nicotine delivery system contained or was used in combination with an e-liquid, any tobacco product, 59 60 or any other substance. (b) It shall not be unlawful for an individual under 61 62 the age of 21 years who is an employee of a tobacco, tobacco 63 product, electronic nicotine delivery system, or alternative 64 nicotine product permit holder to handle, transport, or sell tobacco, a tobacco product, an electronic nicotine delivery 65 system, or an alternative tobacco product if the employee is 66

67 acting within the line and scope of employment and the permit 68 holder, or an employee of the permit holder who is 21 years of 69 age or older, is present.

70 (b) (c) It is unlawful for any individual under the age 71 of 21 years to present or offer to another person proof of 72 identification which is false, fraudulent, or not actually his 73 or her own proof of identification in order to buy, receive, 74 or otherwise obtain, or attempt to buy, receive, or otherwise 75 obtain, any tobacco, tobacco product, electronic nicotine 76 delivery system, or alternative nicotine product.

77 (c) (d) If a minor is cited for any violation under this 78 section, the citing agency shall <u>make reasonable efforts to</u> 79 notify a parent, legal guardian, or legal custodian of the 80 minor unless the minor has been emancipated by court order or 81 operation of law."

82 Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose 83 or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of 84 local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements

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and application under Section 111.05 of the Constitution of
Alabama of 2022, because the bill defines a new crime or
amends the definition of an existing crime.
Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first
day of the third month following its passage and approval by

90 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
