5	Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC) is
6	generally defined as a digital currency used by a
7	central bank made available to the general public. The
8	U.S. Federal Reserve does not currently recognize or
9	use CBDC.
10	This bill would prohibit any state or local
11	governmental agency from accepting CBDC as a form of
12	payment and would prohibit any governmental agency from
13	participating in testing the use of CBDC by any Federal
14	Reserve branch.

19	AN ACT
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21	Relating to Central Bank Digital Currency; to prohibit
22	governmental agencies from using this type of currency as
23	payment and from participating in testing the use of this
24	currency by the Federal Reserve.
25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. (a) As used in this section, the following
27	terms have the following meanings:
28	(1) CENTRAL BANK DIGITAL CURRENCY. A digital currency,

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- 29 a digital medium of exchange, or a digital monetary unit of
- 30 account issued by the United States Federal Reserve System or
- 31 a federal agency which is made directly available to a
- 32 consumer by such entities. The term includes a digital
- 33 currency, a digital medium of exchange, or a digital monetary
- 34 unit of account issued by the United States Federal Reserve
- 35 System or a federal agency which is processed or validated
- 36 directly by such entities.
- 37 (2) GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY. Any board, commission,
- 38 department, or other agency of the state or any political
- 39 subdivision of the state.
- 40 (b) No governmental agency shall accept a payment using
- 41 central bank digital currency.
- 42 (c) No governmental agency shall participate in any
- 43 test of central bank digital currency by any Federal Reserve
- 44 branch.
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first
- day of the third month following its passage and approval by
- 47 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
