1 Enrolled, An Act, 2 3 4 Relating to Cullman County, to amend Section 45-22-225 5 of the Code of Alabama 1975, to change the composition of the 6 Cullman County Tourism Bureau; and to amend Sections 45-22-242 7 and 45-22-242.11 of the Code of Alabama 1975, to provide for 8 the rate of taxation and for the use of the proceeds of the 9 tax. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 10 11 Section 1. Sections 45-22-225, 45-22-242, and 45-22-242.11, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows: 12 13 "\$45-22-225 14 (a) The Cullman County Tourism Bureau shall be 15 comprised as follows: (1) Two members appointed by the Cullman 16 City Council, of which one shall be an elected city councilman 17 and one shall be a representative of tourism relating to the 18 restaurant industry; (2) two members appointed by the full 19 board of the Cullman Area Chamber of Commerce, of which one 20 shall be either the chair of the chamber or the president of 21 the chamber and one shall be a representative of tourism 22 relating to the Smith Lake Community; (3) two members 23 appointed by the Cullman County Commission, of which one shall

industry or the faith-based tourism industry; (4) one member

be an elected county commissioner and one shall be a

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by the Wallace State Community College President; (6) one

appointed by the hotel association; (5) one member appointed

- 36 (b) Members of the bureau shall serve staggered,
- four-year terms as follows: (1) appointees of the hotel

- 39 County Parks and Recreation Board, and the Cullman City Parks
- 40 and Recreation Board shall serve six--year terms; (2) one
- 41 appointee each for the Cullman City Council, the Cullman Area
- 42 Chamber of Commerce, and the Cullman County Commission shall

- 45 (c) The Cullman County Treasurer shall open a separate

- 49 (a) There is levied in Cullman County, in addition to
- 30 all other taxes now imposed by law, a privilege or license tax

- 56 (b) Upon every person, firm, or corporation engaging in



Cullman County in the business of renting or furnishing any 57 58 room or rooms, lodging, or accommodations to transients in any 59 hotel, motel, inn, tourist camp, tourist cabin, or any other 60 place in which rooms, lodgings, or accommodations are regularly furnished to transients for a consideration, in an 61 62 amount to be determined by the application of the rate of five 63 percent of the charge for the room, rooms, lodgings, or 64 accommodations, including the charge for use or rental of personal property and services furnished in the room. 65 Notwithstanding the foregoing, upon the retirement of existing 66 67 debt for the Exit 305 Interchange, County Road 222 and outstanding debt on the building occupied by the Cullman Area 68 Chamber of Commerce, located at 301 2nd Ave SW, Cullman, AL 69 70 35055, the application of the rate to be charged for the room, 71 rooms, lodgings, or accommodations, including the charge for use or rental of personal property and services furnished in 72 73 the room shall be four percent. There is exempted from the tax 74 levied under this part any rentals or services taxed under the 75 state sales tax provided for in Chapter 23 of Title 40. The 76 tax shall not apply to rooms, lodgings, or accommodations 77 supplied for a period of $\frac{30}{90}$ continuous days or more in any place." 78 79 "\$45-22-242.11 80 (a) The State Department of Revenue shall charge 81 Cullman County for collecting the county lodging taxes levied in this part the lessor of the actual amount of total 82

collections, but the collection charge shall not in any event

exceed 2.5 percent of the total amount of the special county

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85 taxes collected under this part. The charge for collecting the 86 taxes for the county may be deducted each month from the taxes 87 collected before certifying the amount of the proceeds from 88 the taxes due to Cullman County each month. The State 89 Commissioner of Revenue shall pay into the State Treasury all 90 county taxes collected under this part as the taxes are 91 received by the State Department of Revenue. On or before the 92 first day of each successive month, commencing with the month 93 following the month in which the department makes the first collections under this part, the commissioner shall certify to 94 95 the Comptroller the amount of taxes collected under this part and paid into the State Treasury for the benefit of Cullman 96 97 County during the month immediately preceding the making of 98 the certification. Before certifying the amount of the taxes 99 paid into the State Treasury for the benefit of Cullman County during each month, the commissioner may deduct from the taxes 100 101 collected for the month the charges due the department for the 102 collection of the taxes for the county. It shall be the duty 103 of the Comptroller to issue a state warrant each month payable 104 to the Cullman County Commission, Tourism Bureau, in an amount 105 equal to the amount so certified by the State Commissioner of 106 Revenue as having been collected for the use of the county. 107

(b) Upon receiving the tax proceeds, the county treasurer of the Cullman County Tourism Bureau shall transmit the proceeds as follows:

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(1) Two-fifths of the proceeds to the Cullman County
Chamber of Commerce to be used at the discretion of the
chamber of commerce to pay any operational expenses while



promoting small businesses, whilepromotion promoting the of
marketing for of Cullman being as a destination shopping
location, working with and enhancing the City of Cullman's and
Cullman County's Industrial Boards, to and working with the
Cullman County Tourism Board.

- (2) One-fifth of the The remaining three-fifths of the proceeds to shall remain with the Cullman County Tourism Bureau to be used at the discretion of the bureau exclusively for the purpose of promoting tourism through festivals, community events, arts projects and tournaments that benefit throughout the City of Cullman and Cullman County for the benefit of all of the residents of Cullman County. Also, these funds may be used to pay the operational expenses, salaries and benefits of the Bureau's director and staff.
- (3) The remaining two-fifths of the proceeds that are sent to the Cullman County Commission from the Alabama

 Department of Revenue shall continue to be sent to the Cullman Area Chamber of Commerce for the sole purpose of paying off the existing debt, which shall not be extended, of the Exit 305 Interchange, County Road 222. Once the existing debt of the Exit 305, Interchange, County Road 222 debt is paid off, then 100 percent of the two-fifths will transfer for the sole purpose of paying off the remaining outstanding debt on the building occupied by the Cullman Area Chamber of Commerce, located at 301 2nd Ave SW, Cullman, AL 35055, which shall also not be extended. Upon the retirement of the above-mentioned debt, two-fifths of the proceeds shall be transmitted to the Cullman County Tourism Bureau to be used at the discretion of





the bureau exclusively for the purposes stated in subdivision

(2). The remaining one-fifth of the proceeds shall expire on

December 31, 2024.

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
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- (c) Effective June 1, 2021, the balance of the proceeds remaining to be distributed to Cullman County after the cost of collection and distribution to the Alabama Mountain Lakes Association have been deducted pursuant to Section 40-26-20, shall be controlled by the Cullman County Tourism Bureau.
- (d) Effective June 1, 2021, the City of Cullman shall transmit to the Cullman County Tourism Bureau, an amount equal to one-quarter percent of the privilege tax levied and collected, pursuant to Ordinance 2007-7, on persons, firms, or corporations renting accommodations to transients in the City of Cullman."
- Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
