5	TO BE ENTITLED
6	AN ACT
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10	Relating to Cullman County, to amend Section 45-22-225
11	of the Code of Alabama 1975, to change the composition of the
12	Cullman County Tourism Bureau; and to amend Sections 45-22-242
13	and 45-22-242.11 of the Code of Alabama 1975, to provide for
14	the rate of taxation and for the use of the proceeds of the
15	tax.
16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
17	Section 1. Sections 45-22-225, 45-22-242, and 45-22-242.11,
18	Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
19	"\$45-22-225
20	(a) The Cullman County Tourism Bureau shall be
21	comprised as follows: (1) Two members appointed by the Cullman
22	City Council, of which one shall be an elected city councilman
23	and one shall be a representative of tourism relating to the
24	restaurant industry; (2) two members appointed by the full
25	board of the Cullman Area Chamber of Commerce, of which one
26	shall be either the chair of the chamber or the president of
27	the chamber and one shall be a representative of tourism
28	relating to the Smith Lake Community; (3) two members



29 appointed by the Cullman County Commission, of which one shall 30 be an elected county commissioner and one shall be a representative of tourism relating to the agri-tourism 31 32 industry or the faith-based tourism industry; (4) one member 33 appointed by the hotel association; (5) one member appointed 34 by the Wallace State Community College President; (6) one 35 member who shall be the Cullman County Parks and Recreation 36 Director; (7) one member appointed by the Cullman City Parks 37 and Recreation Board Director or President; and (8) one member who shall be a representative of the tourism industry selected 38 39 by a majority vote of the state delegation; provided however, that in the event the delegation vote is tied, the Senator 40 representing Cullman shall make the deciding vote. 41

42 (b) Members of the bureau shall serve staggered, 43 four-year terms as follows: (1) appointees of the hotel association, Wallace State Community College, the Cullman 44 45 County Parks and Recreation Board, and the Cullman City Parks 46 and Recreation Board shall serve six--year terms; (2) one 47 appointee each for the Cullman City Council, the Cullman Area 48 Chamber of Commerce, and the Cullman County Commission shall 49 serve four--year terms; and (3) all other appointees shall 50 serve two-year terms.

51 (c) The Cullman County Treasurer shall open a separate 52 bank account for the Cullman County Tourism Bureau by June 1, 53 2021."

55 (a) There is levied in Cullman County, in addition to 56 all other taxes now imposed by law, a privilege or license tax



57 paralleling the state tax on businesses renting rooms, 58 lodging, or accommodations to transients provided for in 59 Sections 40-26-1 to 40-26-21, inclusive, hereinafter referred 60 to as state lodging tax, in the manner and at the rate 61 hereinafter prescribed.

62 (b) Upon every person, firm, or corporation engaging in 63 Cullman County in the business of renting or furnishing any 64 room or rooms, lodging, or accommodations to transients in any 65 hotel, motel, inn, tourist camp, tourist cabin, or any other place in which rooms, lodgings, or accommodations are 66 67 regularly furnished to transients for a consideration, in an amount to be determined by the application of the rate of five 68 percent of the charge for the room, rooms, lodgings, or 69 70 accommodations, including the charge for use or rental of 71 personal property and services furnished in the room. Notwithstanding the foregoing, upon the retirement of existing 72 73 debt for the Exit 305 Interchange, County Road 222 and 74 outstanding debt on the building occupied by the Cullman Area Chamber of Commerce, located at 301 2nd Ave SW, Cullman, AL 75 76 35055, the application of the rate to be charged for the room, 77 rooms, lodgings, or accommodations, including the charge for 78 use or rental of personal property and services furnished in 79 the room shall be four percent. There is exempted from the tax 80 levied under this part any rentals or services taxed under the 81 state sales tax provided for in Chapter 23 of Title 40. The tax shall not apply to rooms, lodgings, or accommodations 82 supplied for a period of $\frac{30}{90}$ continuous days or more in any 83 84 place."

86 (a) The State Department of Revenue shall charge 87 Cullman County for collecting the county lodging taxes levied 88 in this part the lessor of the actual amount of total 89 collections, but the collection charge shall not in any event 90 exceed 2.5 percent of the total amount of the special county taxes collected under this part. The charge for collecting the 91 92 taxes for the county may be deducted each month from the taxes 93 collected before certifying the amount of the proceeds from the taxes due to Cullman County each month. The State 94 95 Commissioner of Revenue shall pay into the State Treasury all county taxes collected under this part as the taxes are 96 received by the State Department of Revenue. On or before the 97 98 first day of each successive month, commencing with the month 99 following the month in which the department makes the first 100 collections under this part, the commissioner shall certify to 101 the Comptroller the amount of taxes collected under this part 102 and paid into the State Treasury for the benefit of Cullman 103 County during the month immediately preceding the making of 104 the certification. Before certifying the amount of the taxes 105 paid into the State Treasury for the benefit of Cullman County 106 during each month, the commissioner may deduct from the taxes 107 collected for the month the charges due the department for the collection of the taxes for the county. It shall be the duty 108 109 of the Comptroller to issue a state warrant each month payable 110 to the Cullman County Commission, Tourism Bureau, in an amount equal to the amount so certified by the State Commissioner of 111 112 Revenue as having been collected for the use of the county.



(b) Upon receiving the tax proceeds, the county treasurer of the Cullman County Tourism Bureau shall transmit the proceeds as follows:

116 (1) Two-fifths of the proceeds to the Cullman County 117 Chamber of Commerce to be used at the discretion of the 118 chamber of commerce to pay any operational expenses while 119 promoting small businesses, while promotion promoting the of 120 marketing-for of Cullman-being as a destination shopping 121 location, working with and enhancing the City of Cullman's and Cullman County's Industrial Boards, to and working with the 122 123 Cullman County Tourism Board.

(2) One-fifth of the The remaining three-fifths of the 124 proceeds toshall remain with the Cullman County Tourism Bureau 125 126 to be used at the discretion of the bureau exclusively for the 127 purpose of promoting tourism through festivals, community 128 events, arts projects and tournaments that benefit throughout the City of Cullman and Cullman County for the benefit of all 129 130 of the residents of Cullman County. Also, these funds may be 131 used to pay the operational expenses, salaries and benefits of 132 the Bureau's director and staff.

133 (3) The remaining two-fifths of the proceeds that are sent to the Cullman County Commission from the Alabama 134 135 Department of Revenue shall continue to be sent to the Cullman 136 Area Chamber of Commerce for the sole purpose of paying off the existing debt, which shall not be extended, of the Exit 137 305 Interchange, County Road 222, Once the existing debt of 138 the Exit 305, Interchange, County Road 222 debt is paid off, 139 140 then 100 percent of the two-fifths will transfer for the sole



141 purpose of paying off the remaining outstanding debt on the building occupied by the Cullman Area Chamber of Commerce, 142 located at 301 2nd Ave SW, Cullman, AL 35055, which shall also 143 144 not be extended. Upon the retirement of the above-mentioned 145 debt, two-fifths of the proceeds shall be transmitted to the 146 Cullman County Tourism Bureau to be used at the discretion of 147 the bureau exclusively for the purposes stated subdivision (2). The remaining one-fifth of the proceeds shall 148 149 December 31, 2024.

(c) Effective June 1, 2021, the balance of the proceeds remaining to be distributed to Cullman County after the cost of collection and distribution to the Alabama Mountain Lakes Association have been deducted pursuant to Section 40-26-20, shall be controlled by the Cullman County Tourism Bureau.

(d) Effective June 1, 2021, the City of Cullman shall transmit to the Cullman County Tourism Bureau, an amount equal to one-quarter percent of the privilege tax levied and collected, pursuant to Ordinance 2007-7, on persons, firms, or corporations renting accommodations to transients in the City of Cullman."

161 Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately 162 following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its 163 otherwise becoming law.

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
