7	TO BE ENTITLED
8	AN ACT
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10	Relating to judges; to provide for additional circuit
11	judgeships and additional district judgeships; to provide for
12	the authority of the judges and for the compensation and
13	benefits of the judges; to prohibit the Judicial Resources
14	Allocation Commission from reallocating any vacant judgeships
15	until January 1, 2027; and to require the Administrative
16	Office of Courts to provide certain statistical data annually.
17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. (a)(1) There is created an additional
19	circuit judgeship for the Eleventh Judicial Circuit which
20	shall be designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 4.
21	(2) There is created an additional circuit judgeship
22	for the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit which shall be designated
23	as Circuit Judgeship Number 4. The judge elected to Judgeship
24	Number 4 may reside in any county within the Nineteenth
25	Judicial Circuit. The judge occupying Judgeship Number 4 shall
26	be assigned to the domestic relations division of the circuit.
27	(3) There is created an additional circuit judgeship
28	for the Twenty-third Judicial Circuit which shall be



29 designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 9. 30 (4) There is created an additional circuit judgeship 31 for the Twenty-eighth Judicial Circuit which shall be 32 designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 6. 33 (5) There is created an additional district judgeship 34 for Baldwin County which shall be designated as District 35 Judgeship Number 3. 36 (6) There is created an additional district judgeship 37 for DeKalb County which shall be designated as District Judgeship Number 2. 38 39 (7) There is created an additional district judgeship for Mobile County which shall be designated as District 40 Judgeship Number 6. 41 (b) The additional judgeships created pursuant to 42 43 subsection (a) shall be filled at the 2024 General Election. (c) The initial judges elected to the additional 44 45 judgeships created pursuant to subsection (a) shall serve for 46 a six-year term holding office from the first Monday following 47 the second Tuesday in January after the general election at 48 which the judges are elected. 49 (d) The initial judges elected to the additional 50 judgeships created pursuant to subsection (a) shall have and 51 shall exercise all the jurisdiction, power, rights, and 52 authority and shall possess all of the qualifications, perform 53 all of the duties, and shall be subject to all of the 54 responsibilities and duties of the office to which other judges are subject. 55 56 (e) The annual compensation of the additional judges



57 elected pursuant to subsection (a) shall be in accordance with 58 Chapter 10B of Title 12, Code of Alabama 1975, including, but 59 not limited to, the provision that no judge first elected or 60 appointed to office after October 1, 2021, may be provided a 61 salary supplement or expense allowance.

Section 2. (a) (1) There is created an additional
circuit judgeship for the Sixth Judicial Circuit which shall
be designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 7.

(2) There is created an additional circuit judgeship
for the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit which shall be designated
as Circuit Judgeship Number 5. The judge elected to Judgeship
Number 5 may reside in any county within the Nineteenth
Judicial Circuit.

70 (3) There is created an additional circuit judgeship
71 for the Twenty-eighth Judicial Circuit which shall be
72 designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 7.

(4) There is created an additional circuit judgeship
for the Thirty-seventh Judicial Circuit which shall be
designated as Circuit Judgeship Number 4.

(5) There is created an additional district judgeship
for Madison County which shall be designated as District
Judgeship Number 5.

(6) There is created an additional district judgeship
for Shelby County which shall be designated as District
Judgeship Number 3.

(b) The additional judgeships created pursuant to
subsection (a) shall be filled at the 2026 General Election.
(c) The initial judges elected to the additional



judgeships created pursuant to subsection (a) shall serve for a six-year term holding office from the first Monday following the second Tuesday in January after the general election at which the judges are elected.

(d) The initial judges elected to the additional judgeships created pursuant to subsection (a) shall have and shall exercise all the jurisdiction, power, rights, and authority and shall possess all of the qualifications, perform all of the duties, and shall be subject to all of the responsibilities and duties of the office to which other judges are subject.

96 (e) The annual compensation of the additional judges 97 elected pursuant to subsection (a) shall be in accordance with 98 Chapter 10B of Title 12, Code of Alabama 1975, including, but 99 not limited to, the provision that no judge first elected or 100 appointed to office after October 1, 2021, may be provided a 101 salary supplement or expense allowance.

Section 3. Notwithstanding Section 12-9A-2, Code of Alabama 1975, or any other law to the contrary, a moratorium on the reallocation of judges by the Judicial Resources Allocation Commission for reallocating any vacant judgeships shall be in effect until January 1, 2027.

Section 4. (a) The Administrative Office of Courts shall provide the following statistics for each fiscal year by circuit as provided in subsection (b):

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(b) The information required in subsection (a) shall be

148	(5) The chair of the Senate Judiciary Committee.

150	(7) The Legislative Fiscal Officer.
