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SYNOPSIS:

Existing law provides educational tuition reimbursement for qualified active members of the Alabama National Guard.

> This bill would extend tuition reimbursement for dually or concurrently enrolled high school and college students.

This bill would set the cap for private college tuition reimbursement at the rate of the public institution with the highest tuition and instructional rate fees.

This bill would also clarify that the Alabama National Guard Education Assistance Program may only pay for the first degree obtained and that short certificates, long certificates, and associate degrees are considered stackable undergraduate credentials which may be used to obtain a baccalaureate degree, with the first degree obtained being considered a baccalaureate degree.

39	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
10	Section 1. Sections 31-10-2, 31-10-3, and 31-10-4.1 of
11	the Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
12	" §31-10-2
13	The following words used in this article shall have the
14	following meanings as set forth by this section:
15	(1)(2) ALABAMA NATIONAL GUARD. Federally recognized
16	units of the Alabama National Guard.
17	$\frac{(2)}{(1)}$ ACTIVE MEMBER. A member of a federally
18	recognized unit of the Alabama National Guard meeting the
19	minimum requirements for satisfactory membership as defined in
50	the Department of the Army and Department of the Air Force
51	regulations.
52	(3) TUITION. The per semester cost of instruction and
53	<pre>mandatory instructional fees to the student not to exceed the</pre>
54	average cost of tuition per semester of a state-supported
55	Alabama four year institution, as reported to the Alabama
56	Commission on Higher Education by state-supported institutions



57 of higher education and appearing on the tuition plus required 58 fees report of the commission, for classes or courses that 59 count towards the individual's degree or certificate plan as 60 designed and approved by the college or institution attended for the individual's declared program of study. Such The 81 payments or reimbursements shall be made timely at the end of each academic quarter or semester for all tuition 82 reimbursements, and shall be made on the basis of certified 83 84 invoices submitted by **such**the institution or school to the

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85	Alabama Commission on Higher Education, and shall be supported
86	by names of the students receiving such benefits, together
87	with the amounts claimed for each student. To be eligible for
88	such benefits, the individual, at the time of his or her
89	enrollment must be an active member of the Alabama National
90	Guard in good standing and an active member of a federally
91	recognized unit of the Alabama National Guard. The member must
92	be at least 17 years of age and must be a resident of the
93	State of Alabama. The tuition reimbursement authorized under
94	this article may be used for undergraduate or graduate
95	studies. In no event will any individual be eligible to
96	receive more than 100 percent of qualified tuition when
97	combined with similar federal veterans! educational benefits
98	available to members of the National Guard. All applicants for
99	tuition reimbursement shall complete a Free Application for
100	Student Financial Aid (FAFSA). In no event shall payments under
101	the Alabama National Guard Educational Assistance Program
102	amount to more than 100 percent of qualified tuition and fees.
103	No person individual shall be eligible for tuition
104	reimbursement for more than 12 years after the date of the
105	first tuition payment to him or her under this article. For
106	degrees above the baccalaureate, only 10 percent of the total
107	funds of the benefit program are to be utilized. The Alabama
108	Commission on Higher Education shall set up minimum standards
109	for performance that must be met in order to maintain
110	eligibility for the continuation of the receipt of tuition
111	reimbursements under this article that will ensure a member
112	will maintain at least a 2.0 cumulative grade point average.

- 123 (a) Beginning October 1, 2016, any member of the
- 124 Alabama National Guard enrolled in a program leading to a
- 125 certificate, or an associate or bachelor's degree at an
- 126 accredited public institution of higher education, technical
- 127 college, or community college within the State of Alabama may
- 128 apply for a tuition reimbursement benefit as provided for in
- 129 this section if the applicant under this chapterarticle meets
- 130 the following requirements:
- 131 (1) The individual is 17 years of age or over.
- 132 (2) The individual is a member of the Alabama National
- 133 Guard in good standing throughout the period or semester for
- 134 which that individual receives education educational benefits
- as indicated by continued satisfactory participation in the
- 136 Alabama National Guard as required by all applicable laws and
- 137 regulations of the Department of the Army, the Department of
- the Air Force, and the Alabama National Guard, and there is no
- 139 unfavorable administrative action pending against him or her.

141 <u>Student Financial Aid, except for students dually or</u>
142 concurrently enrolled in high school and college.

- (b) Any member of the Alabama National Guard receiving educational benefits under this section and the educational institutions they attend must-shall comply with the standards of Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) as required for Title IV benefits under the Higher Education Act and as defined by that education institution provided the member must-shall maintain at least a cumulative 2.0 grade point average, or the letter equivalent. Those students who would no longer be eligible to receive Title IV benefits due to a failure to meet SAP standards shall no longer be eligible to receive benefits under this section.
- (c) To the extent permitted by law, prior to applying any benefits provided for under this section, institutional certifying officials and financial aid officials shall first apply other federal, state, institutional, and third party scholarships and grants awarded to the member for that academic period for payment of required educational expenses during an academic period, but only for classes or courses that count towards the individual's degree or certificate plan as designed and approved by the college or institution attended for the individual's declared program of studythe benefits provided for under this section shall be applied in a manner to maximize all of the member's educational benefits.
- (d) No public institution of higher education in this state shall impose a nonresident tuition rate or differential out-of-state resident fee on an Alabama National Guard member



in good standing and who meets the requirements of subsection (a).

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- (e) All requirements under subsections (a) and (b) shall be met as a condition of obtaining any education assistance benefits under this chapterarticle and continued eligibility for this exemption.
 - (f) The Alabama Commission on Higher Education shall be responsible for administering the overall policies, guidance, implementation, and proper utilization of the scholarship under this section.
- 179 (g) The tuition scholarship under this chapterarticle shall be claimed for no more than a total of 120 academic 180 hours or until the receipt of the first degree for which the 181 182 scholarship is used, whichever comes first. The tuition 183 benefits provided by this article shall only pay for the first degree obtained after approval for benefits under this 184 185 article. For the purposes of this article, short certificates, 186 long certificates, and associate degrees are considered 187 stackable undergraduate credentials which may be used to 188 obtain a baccalaureate degree; with the first degree obtained 189 while enrolled in a short certificate or long certificate 190 program being considered a baccalaureate degree.
 - (h) Any member of the Alabama National Guard who fails to remain in good standing or is terminated from further service in the Alabama National Guard shall no longer be eligible for exemption benefits under this section and any benefits received by the member for the period, semester, or term in which he or she becomes ineligible shall be repaid by



197 the member to the exempting institution.

- (i) Any member who is expelled or dismissed by an institution of higher learning that provides scholarship benefits under this section to that member shall no longer be eligible for scholarship benefits under this section and shall repay all benefits received under this section to the institution.
- (j) Any member who is disqualified from serving in the Alabama National Guard due solely to medical reasons, with a Veterans Administration disability rating of 40 percent or greater, shall be exempt from repaying any benefits received under this section.
- 209 (k) Any participating member of the Alabama National
 210 Guard Educational Assistance Program shall sign a promissory
 211 note or similar document with provisions for the collection
 212 and repayment of benefits in the event that the member is
 213 disqualified or otherwise becomes ineligible to continue to
 214 receive benefits pursuant to the section."
 - Section 2. Specifically Article 2, commencing with Section 31-10-20, of Chapter 10 of Title 31 of the Code of Alabama 1975, relating to supplemental educational assistance benefits for qualified active members of the National Guard, is repealed.
- Section 3. This act shall become effective on the last day of the month of its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
