## House Constitution, Campaigns and Elections Reported Substitute for HB209

A BILL

TO BE ENTITLED

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AN ACT Relating to voting; to prohibit any person from distributing, ordering, requesting, collecting, prefilling, obtaining, or delivering an absentee ballot application or absentee ballot of another person in certain circumstances; to provide for exceptions; to prohibit a person from receiving a payment or providing a payment to another person for distributing, ordering, requesting, collecting, prefilling, completing, obtaining, or delivering an absentee ballot application or absentee ballot of another person in certain circumstance; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: Section 1. (a) Except as provided in subsection (c), it shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly distribute, order, request, collect, prefill, obtain, or deliver an absentee ballot application or absentee ballot in addition to

his or her own absentee ballot application or absentee ballot.



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- 29 (b) Any person who violates this section shall be 30 quilty of a Class D felony.
- 31 (c) Any voter requiring assistance in ordering,
  32 requesting, obtaining, or delivering an absentee ballot
  33 application may gain assistance from any of the following:
- 34 (1) Any family member to the second degree of kinship, 35 including, but not limited to, an aunt, uncle, grandparent, 36 grandchild, niece, nephew, parent, full-sibling, half-sibling, 37 or child.
- 38 (2) A resident of the household who has resided with 39 the voter for more than six months immediately prior to the 40 voter submitting his or her absentee ballot application.
- 41 (3) The Alabama Secretary of State or an employee of 42 the Alabama Secretary of State designated in writing by the 43 Alabama Secretary of State.
- 44 (4) The judge of probate or an employee designated in 45 writing by the judge of probate for the county in which the 46 elector resides.
- 47 (5) The absentee election manager for the county in which the elector resides for elections.
- 49 (6) The absentee election manager for the municipality 50 in which the voter votes for municipal elections.
- 51 (7) A guardian, conservator, or other individual 52 appointed by order of the probate court.
- (e) Electors voting by absentee ballot through the
  Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act are not
  subject to this section.
- Section 2. It shall be an affirmative defense under



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- 57 Section 1 if an individual, of the voter's choosing, provides
- assistance to a voter due to the voter being blind, disabled,
- or unable to read or write, pursuant to 52 U.S.C. § 10508.
- Section 3. (a) It shall be unlawful for a third party
- to knowingly receive a payment for distributing, ordering,
- 62 requesting, collecting, completing, prefilling, obtaining, or
- delivering another voter's absentee ballot application or
- 64 absentee ballot.
- (b) It shall be unlawful for a person to knowingly pay
- 66 a third party to distribute, order, request, collect, prefill,
- 67 complete, obtain, or deliver another voter's absentee ballot
- 68 application or absentee ballot.
- (c) (1) Any person who violates subsection(a) shall be
- 70 quilty of a Class C felony.
- 71 (2) Any person who violates subsection (b) shall be
- 72 guilty of a Class B felony.
- 73 Section 4. Although this bill would have as its purpose
- or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of
- 75 local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements
- 76 and application under Section 111.05 of the Constitution of
- 77 Alabama of 2022, because the bill defines a new crime or
- amends the definition of an existing crime.
- 79 Section 5. This act shall become effective immediately
- 80 following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its
- 81 otherwise becoming law.
