7	TO BE ENTITLED
8	AN ACT
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10	Proposing to amend Section 71.01 of the Constitution of
11	Alabama of 2022, to authorize the Legislature to sign and
12	transmit local laws before the transmission of basic
13	appropriations.
14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
15	Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution
16	of Alabama of 2022, is proposed and shall become valid as a
17	part of the constitution when approved by a majority of the
18	qualified electors voting thereon at the statewide primary
19	election held on March 5, 2024, and in accordance with
20	Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of
21	2022:
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23	PROPOSED AMENDMENT
24	Section 71.01 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022,
25	is amended to read as follows:
26	"Section 71.01
27	(A) The following words and phrases, whenever used in
28	this amendment, shall have the following respective meanings:



"Basic Appropriations" means, with respect to any 29 30 regular session of the legislature, such appropriations as the 31 legislature may deem appropriate for the expenditures by the 32 state during the ensuing budget period for the ordinary 33 expenses of the executive, legislative and judicial departments branches of the state, for payment of the public 34 35 debt, and for education (excluding, however, any item within 36 the scope of the foregoing that is at the time provided for by 37 a continuing appropriation or otherwise).

38 "Budget Period" means a fiscal year of the state or 39 such period other than <u>[a] a</u> fiscal year as may hereafter be 40 fixed by law as the period with respect to which state budgets 41 are prepared and state appropriations are made.

(B) On or before the second legislative day of each regular session of the legislature, beginning with the first regular session after January 1, 1983, the governor shall transmit to the legislature for its consideration a proposed budget for the then next ensuing budget period.

47 (C) The duty of the legislature at any regular session 48 to make the basic appropriations for any budget period that 49 will commence before the first day of any succeeding regular 50 session shall be paramount; and, accordingly, beginning with 51 the first regular session held after January 1, 1983, no bill 52 (other than a bill making any of the basic appropriations) 53 shall be signed by either the presiding officer of the house 54 or senate and transmitted to the other house until bills 55 making the basic appropriations for the then ensuing budget 56 period shall have been signed by the presiding officer of each



57 house of the legislature in accordance with Section 66 of this 58 Constitution and presented to the governor in accordance with Section 125 of this Constitution; provided, that this 59 60 paragraph (C) shall not affect the passage of local laws-or local constitutional amendments, the adoption of resolutions, 61 or the conduct of any other legislative functions that do not 62 63 require a third reading; and provided further, that following 64 adoption, by vote of either house of not less than 65 three-fifths of a quorum present, of a resolution declaring that the provisions of this paragraph (C) shall not be 66 67 applicable in that house to a particular bill, which shall be specified in said resolution by number and title, the bill so 68 specified may proceed to final passage therein. 69

70 (D) Upon the signing and presentation to the governor 71 in accordance with the said Sections 66 and 125 of bills making the basic appropriations, the provisions of the 72 73 foregoing paragraph (C) prohibiting the final passage of bills 74 in the house and senate (other than bills making any part of 75 the basic appropriations) shall cease to be effective and 76 shall not be revived or become again effective as a result of 77 (i) the subsequent legislative history of any bill so signed 78 and presented, including any veto, return with executive amendment, or any other action, or failure to act, by either 79 80 the governor or the legislature under the provisions of the 81 said Section 125; or (ii) a determination, by either judicial decree or opinion of the justices of the Alabama Supreme 82 Court, that any bill so signed and presented is wholly or in 83 84 part invalid.



(E) The legislature may, by statute or rule, make such
further provisions for the timely passage of bills making the
basic appropriations as are not inconsistent with the
provisions of this Constitution.

(F) Nothing contained herein shall be construed as
requiring the legislature to make any appropriation not
otherwise required by this Constitution to be made.

92 (G) Notwithstanding any provision of this amendment, 93 any resolution authorizing the consideration of a bill 94 proposing a local law adopted before November 8, 2016March 5, 95 <u>2024</u>, that conformed to the rules of either body of the 96 Legislature at the time it was adopted, is ratified, approved, 97 validated, and confirmed, and the application of any such 98 resolution is effective from the date of original adoption."

99 Upon ratification of this constitutional amendment, the Code Commissioner shall number and place this amendment as 100 appropriate in the constitution omitting this instructional 101 102 paragraph and may make the following nonsubstantive revisions: 103 change capitalization, spelling, and punctuation for purposes 104 of style and uniformity; correct manifest grammatical, 105 clerical, and typographical errors; and correct incorrect 106 cross-references.

107 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 108 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the 109 Constitution of Alabama of 2022, and the election laws of this 110 state.

111 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 112 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional

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amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:

"Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, to amend Section 71.01 authorizing the Legislature to sign and transmit local laws before the transmission of basic appropriations.
