7	TO BE ENTITLED
8	AN ACT
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10	Relating to the Alabama Move Over Act; to amend Section
11	32-5A-58.2, Code of Alabama 1975, to increase the penalties
12	for a violation; to provide increased criminal penalties under
13	certain circumstances; and in connection therewith would have
14	as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased
15	expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Section
16	111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.
17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. Section 32-5A-58.2, Code of Alabama 1975, is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	"\$32-5A-58.2
21	(a) This section shall be known as the "Alabama John
22	<u>Hubbard</u> Move Over Act."
23	(b) $\frac{(1)}{(1)}$ When an authorized law enforcement vehicle or
24	emergency vehicle making use of any visual signals is parked,
25	when a wrecker displaying amber rotating or flashing lights is
26	performing a recovery or loading on the roadside or otherwise
27	performing tasks associated with the provision of wrecker
28	services, when a utility service vehicle operated by or on

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behalf of an entity providing utility services displaying any rotating lights, flashing lights, or other visual signals is parked on the roadside while performing tasks associated with the provision of utility services, when a vehicle displaying flashing lights is parked or engaged in the performance of official duties on or along a road, or when a garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling collection vehicle is actively collecting garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling materials on the roadside, the driver of every other vehicle, as soon as it is safe, shall do the following: a. (1) When driving on an interstate highway or other highway with two or more lanes traveling in the direction of the law enforcement vehicle, emergency vehicle, wrecker, utility service vehicle, vehicle displaying flashing lights, or garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling collection vehicle, the driver shall vacate the lane closest to the law enforcement vehicle, emergency vehicle, wrecker, utility service vehicle, vehicle displaying flashing lights, or garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling collection vehicle, unless otherwise directed by a law enforcement officer. If it is not safe to move over, the driver shall slow to a speed that is at least 15 miles per hour less than the posted speed limit unless otherwise directed by a law enforcement officer. **▶.** (2) When driving on a two-lane road, the driver shall move as far away from the law enforcement vehicle, emergency vehicle, wrecker, utility service vehicle, vehicle displaying flashing lights, or garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling collection vehicle as possible within his or her lane and slow



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57 to a speed that is 15 miles per hour less than the posted 58 speed limit when the posted speed limit is 25 miles per hour or greater or travel at 10 miles per hour when the posted 59 60 speed limit is 20 miles per hour or less, unless otherwise 61 directed by a law enforcement officer. (2)(c)(1) A violation of this subsection is a 62 63 misdemeanor punishable by a fine of one two hundred dollars 64 (\$100) (\\$200). Upon a second violation of this subsection, the 65 fine shall be one two hundred fifty dollars (\$150) (\$250). Upon a third or subsequent violation, the fine shall be twothree 66 67 hundred dollars (\$200) (\$300) and, in addition, the court shall submit a copy of the violation to the Secretary of the Alabama 68 69 State Law Enforcement Agency and order the secretary to suspend the driving privileges of the individual for a period 70 71 of not less than 90 days. (2) If a person violates this section while also in 72 73 violation any of the following sections, the person shall 74

- receive, at a minimum, a fine or sentence double the minimum penalty otherwise provided by law:
- 76 a. Section 32-5A-191, relating to driving under the 77 influence.
- 78 b. Section 32-5A-190, relating to reckless driving.
- 79 c. Section 32-5A-176.1, relating to construction zone 80 moving violations.
- 81 d. Section 32-5A-350.1, relating to wireless 82 telecommunications device violations.

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e. Section 32-5A-178, relating to racing on public 83 84 highways.



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(d) If a violation of this section is the proximate
cause of a collision with an authorized emergency vehicle,
wrecker, or other vehicle performing duties as described under
subsection (b), the person shall be punished as follows:
(1) If the collision results in physical injury to any
individual, the person shall be guilty of a Class A
<u>misdemeanor.</u>
(2) If the collision results in serious physical injury
to any individual, the person shall be guilty of a Class C
felony.
(3) If the collision results in the death of any
individual, the person shall be guilty of a Class B felony.
(e) The provisions of Article 4A of Chapter 18 of Title
15, relating to restitution for victims of crimes, shall apply
to any collision described under subsection (d).
(c)(1)(f) The Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency
shall provide an educational awareness campaign informing the
motoring public about this section, including information to
assist the operators of motor vehicles to determine the best
option of whether to move over or slow down as required under
subsection (a). The agency shall provide information about
this section in all newly printed driver's driver license
educational materials after January 1, 2010 2025.
$\frac{(2)}{(g)}$ This section shall not relieve the driver of an
authorized emergency vehicle from the duty to drive with due
regard for the safety of all persons using the highway."
Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose

or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of



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- local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements
 and application under Section 111.05 of the Constitution of
 Alabama of 2022, because the bill defines a new crime or
 amends the definition of an existing crime.
