7	TO BE ENTITLED
8	AN ACT
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10	Relating to food products; to prohibit the manufacture,
11	sale, or distribution of food products made from cultured
12	animal cells in this state; to provide penalties for
13	violations; and in connection therewith would have as its
14	purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased
15	expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Section
16	111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.
17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this section, the
19	term "cultivated food product" means any food product produced
20	from cultured animal cells.
21	(b)(1) It shall be unlawful for any person to
22	manufacture, sell, hold or offer for sale, or distribute any
23	cultivated food product in this state.
24	(2) A violation of this subsection is a Class C
25	misdemeanor.
26	(c)(1) A food sales establishment, as defined in
27	Section 20-1-20, Code of Alabama 1975, that sells or
28	distributes cultivated food products in violation of



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29 subsection (b) shall be subject to disciplinary action 30 pursuant to Section 20-1-34, Code of Alabama 1975.

(2) The food safety permit of a food sales
establishment may be suspended or revoked as provided in
Section 20-1-33, Code of Alabama 1975, upon the conviction of
an owner or an employee of the establishment for a violation
of subsection (b) in connection with the establishment.

36 (d) (1) A food establishment, as defined by rule of the 37 Department of Public Health, that sells or distributes 38 cultivated food products in violation of subsection (b) shall 39 be subject to all enforcement measures as provided by rule of 40 the Department of Public Health.

41 (2) The permit of a food establishment may be suspended
42 or revoked as provided by rule of the Department of Public
43 Health upon the conviction of an owner or an employee of the
44 establishment for a violation of subsection (b) in connection
45 with the establishment.

46 (e) The Department of Agriculture and Industries and
47 the Department of Public Health may adopt rules as necessary
48 to implement this section.

(f) Nothing in this section shall be construed as
preventing any federal, state, or local governmental entity or
institution of higher education, or a person that is partnered
with a governmental entity or institution of higher education
as evidenced by a formal agreement, from conducting research
in this state regarding the production of cultivated food
products.

56 Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose

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57 or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of 58 local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements 59 and application under Section 111.05 of the Constitution of 60 Alabama of 2022, because the bill defines a new crime or 61 amends the definition of an existing crime.

62 Section 3. This act shall become effective on October 63 1, 2024.
