A BILL  
TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

Relating to juveniles; to authorize the state to establish concurrent jurisdiction for criminal offenses committed by children on military installations.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the state shall exercise concurrent jurisdiction with the United States over a military installation of the United States Department of Defense located within this state in a matter relating to a violation of federal law by a child, as defined in Section 12-15-102, Code of Alabama 1975, within the boundaries of that military installation, if both of the following criteria are met:

(1) The United States Attorney or the United States District Court for the applicable district in this state waives exclusive jurisdiction.

(2) The violation of federal law is also a crime under state law.

Section 2. When concurrent jurisdiction has been established pursuant to Section 1, the juvenile court, as defined in Section 12-15-102, Code of Alabama 1975, has

29 exclusive original jurisdiction over any case involving a  
30 **child**, as defined in Section **12-15-102, Code of Alabama 1975,**  
31 who is alleged to be delinquent as the result of an act  
32 committed within the boundaries of a military installation  
33 that is a crime under state law.

34 Section 3. This act shall become effective on October  
35 1, 2024.
