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4 SYNOPSIS:

5 Under existing law, an individual who is retired under the Employees' Retirement System, has the 6 applicable Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and 7 Training certification, and was classified as a law 8 9 enforcement officer or a state policeman prior to 10 retirement may work as a school resource officer or a correctional officer without suspension of his or her 11 retirement allowance, provided that his or her 12 13 compensation does not exceed \$52,000 per year.

14 This bill would further allow an individual who is retired under the Employees' Retirement System, has 15 16 the applicable Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training certification, and was classified as a law 17 enforcement officer or a state policeman prior to 18 19 retirement to work as a law enforcement officer for any 20 state, county, or municipal law enforcement agency, or 21 any state college or university, without suspension of 22 his or her retirement allowance or a cap on the amount 23 of compensation earned.

Relating to the Employees' Retirement System; to amend Section 36-27-8.2, as last amended by Act 2023-334, 2023 Regular Session, and Act 2023-564, 2023 2nd Special Session, Code of Alabama 1975; to further provide for the employment of retired law enforcement officers as law enforcement officers. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

36 Section 1. Section 36-27-8.2, as last amended by Act 37 2023-334, 2023 Regular Session, and Act 2023-564, 2023 2nd 38 Special Session, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as 39 follows:

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"§36-27-8.2

41 (a) Any individual who is retired under the Employees' 42 Retirement System may perform duties in any capacity, 43 including as an independent contractor, with any employer participating in the Employees' Retirement System or the 44 45 Teachers' Retirement System without suspension of his or her 46 retirement allowance provided that: (1) the individual is not 47 employed in a permanent full-time capacity; and (2) the 48 individual's compensation from the employer in calendar year 49 2016 does not exceed thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000). 50 Beginning in calendar year 2017, and each calendar year 51 thereafter, the annual earning limit shall be increased by the 52 same percentage increase as the increase in the Consumer Price 53 Index for all urban consumers as published by the U.S. 54 Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. Any increase in the annual earning limit shall be rounded to the next 55 56 lowest multiple of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) with any



amount in excess of the one thousand dollar (\$1,000) multiple considered in determining the increase for the following year. Each adjustment shall be based on the increase in the index for the preceding 12-month period ending on September 30 and the increase shall be effective for the following calendar year.

63 (b) Any individual serving as an elected official who 64 has retired from the Employees' Retirement System may serve 65 for compensation in an elected public office with the state, a 66 county, or an incorporated municipality without suspension of 67 retirement benefits; provided that under no circumstances shall such an individual participate in or accrue additional 68 69 benefits under the Teachers' Retirement System or the 70 Employees' Retirement System, and provided that under no 71 circumstances shall an individual whose retirement is based upon service as an elected official continue in or return to 72 73 the office and receive both pension benefits and salary; 74 provided further, that this subsection shall apply to elected 75 officials whose participation in the Teachers' Retirement 76 System or the Employees' Retirement System is constitutionally 77 required to be upon the same terms and conditions as specified 78 by law for other employees in the retirement system if the 79 elected official's compensation does not exceed the annual 80 earning limits provided in subsection (a).

81 (c) The responsibility for compliance with this section 82 is placed upon the employing authority, and each retiree 83 performing duties under this section shall certify to the 84 employer any information required in order to carry out this



85 section. The retiree shall provide written notice of the 86 postretirement employment under this section to the Employees' 87 Retirement System and employing authority within 30 days after 88 the date the retiree knows or should know that he or she will 89 be performing duties on a full-time or permanent basis or will 90 earn an amount in excess of the annual earning limit under 91 this section.

92 (d) (1) Any individual who is retired under the Employees' Retirement System, has the applicable Alabama Peace 93 Officers' Standards and Training certification, and was 94 95 classified as either a law enforcement officer, as defined in Section 36-27-59, or a state policeman, as defined in Section 96 97 36-27-1, prior to retirement, may perform duties as either a school resource officer, as defined in Section 16-1-44.1, or a 98 99 correctional officer with the Department of Corrections without suspension of his or her retirement allowance, 100 101 provided that the compensation earned does not exceed 102 fifty-two thousand dollars (\$52,000) per year.

103 (2) Any individual who is retired under the Employees' 104 Retirement System, has the applicable Alabama Peace Officers' 105 Standards and Training certification, and meets any of the 106 following criteria, may perform duties as a correctional 107 officer with the Department of Corrections without suspension 108 of his or her retirement allowance, provided that the 109 compensation earned does not exceed fifty-two thousand dollars 110 (\$52,000) per year:

a. Was classified as a law enforcement officer, asdefined in Section 36-27-59, prior to retirement.



- b. Was classified as a state policeman, as defined in Section 36-27-1, prior to retirement.
- 115 c. Was classified as a correctional officer, as defined 116 in Section 36-27-59, prior to retirement, and retired pursuant 117 to Section 36-27-16(a)(1)c.
- 118 (3) No individual may be employed pursuant to this 119 subsection after December 31, 2026.
- 120 (e) Any individual who is retired under the Employees'
- 121 Retirement System, has the applicable Alabama Peace Officers'
- 122 Standards and Training certification, and was classified as
- 123 either a law enforcement officer, as defined in Section
- 124 <u>36-27-59</u>, or a state policeman, as defined in Section 36-27-1,
- 125 prior to retirement, may perform duties as a law enforcement
- 126 officer for any state, county, or municipal law enforcement
- 127 agency, or any state college or university pursuant to Section
- 128 16-22-1, without suspension of his or her retirement
- 129 allowance."
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 131 1, 2024.
