4 SYNOPSIS:

> Under the constitution, the state may not lend money or lend its credit except as expressly authorized by the constitution and may not incur certain debt. Also under the constitution, the Legislature may not authorize any county or municipality to lend its credit or grant public money to any person.

> This bill would propose an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, to authorize the Legislature, by law, to authorize counties and municipalities to provide for the incorporation of innovation districts as public corporations and provide for their powers and to authorize innovation districts to provide any public funds, revenues, or property of or under the control of innovation districts to, or for the benefit of, any public or private person or entity.

> This bill would also provide that all financial obligations incurred by an innovation district shall be exclusively the obligation of the innovation district and not the state.

30 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama 31 of 2022, relating to economic development; to authorize the 32 Legislature, by law, to authorize counties and municipalities 33 to provide for the incorporation of innovation districts as 34 public corporations and provide for their powers; to authorize 35 innovation districts to provide any public funds, revenues, or 36 property of or under the control of a district to or for the 37 benefit of a public or private person or entity; and to provide that all financial obligations of an innovation 38 39 district shall be exclusively the obligation of the innovation district and not the state. 40

- 41 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, is proposed:
- 44 PROPOSED AMENDMENT
- 45 (a) Notwithstanding any provision of the constitution 46 to the contrary, including, but not limited to, Sections 93, 47 94, and 213, the Legislature, by general law, may authorize 48 all of the following:
- (1) Counties and municipalities in this state to
 provide for the incorporation of innovation districts and
 their corporate nature, governance, operations, and powers as
 public corporations of the state.
- 53 (2) An innovation district, in its sole discretion, to 54 provide any public funds, revenues, or property of or under 55 the control of the innovation district to, or for the benefit 56 of, any public or private person or entity.



(b) All financial obligations assumed, incurred, or issued by an innovation district shall be solely and exclusively an obligation of the innovation district and shall not create a direct, indirect, or contingent obligation or pecuniary liability, or general obligation, or charge against the general assets, credit, funds, property, revenues, or taxing power of the state or any subdivision, including, but not limited to, any county or municipality that authorizes an innovation district.

Upon ratification of this constitutional amendment, the Code Commissioner shall number and place this amendment as appropriate in the constitution omitting this instructional paragraph and may make the following nonsubstantive revisions: change capitalization, hierarchy, spelling, and punctuation for purposes of style and uniformity; correct manifest grammatical, clerical, and typographical errors; revise internal or external citations and cross-references; harmonize language; and translate effective dates.

END OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, and the election laws of this state. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:

- 85 of 2022, to allow the Legislature, by general law, to 86 authorize counties and municipalities to provide for the 87 incorporation of innovation districts as public corporations 88 and provide for their powers, to authorize innovation 89 districts to provide public funds or property of or under the 90 control of the district to any public or private person or 91 entity, and to provide that all financial obligations of an 92 innovation district shall be exclusively the obligation of the 93 innovation district and not the state or any subdivision of 94 the state. Proposed by Act ." 95 96 This description shall be followed by the following 97 language: "Yes() No()." 98
- 99 Section 3. The proposed amendment shall become valid as 100 a part of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, when approved 101 by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon.
