

# House Boards, Agencies and Commissions Reported Substitute for SB122

6	TO BE ENTITLED
7	AN ACT
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9	Relating to the Alabama Sunset Law; to continue the
10	existence and functioning of the Alabama Board of Electrical
11	Contractors until October 1, 2026, with certain modifications,
12	to amend Sections 34-36-7 and 34-36-16, Code of Alabama 1975,
13	to prohibit the issuance of new provisional electrical
14	contractors licenses; and to permit the renewal of existing
15	provisional electrical contractors licenses.
16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
17	Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the
18	Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the Alabama
19	Board of Electrical Contractors until October 1, 2026, with
20	the additional recommendation for statutory change as set out
21	in Section 3.
22	Section 2. The existence and functioning of the Alabama
23	Board of Electrical Contractors, created and functioning
24	pursuant to Chapter 36 of Title 34, Code of Alabama 1975, is
25	continued until October 1, 2026, and those code sections are
26	expressly preserved.
27	Section 3. Sections 34-36-7 and 34-36-16 of the Code of
28	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:



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- 30 (a) All applicants for licensure as an electrical 31 contractor or journeyman electrician must submit a completed 32 application, application fee, and supportive documentation of 33 qualifications before taking an examination approved by the 34 board. The board shall examine applicants at least once every 35 three months according to the method deemed by it the board to 36 be the most appropriate to test the qualifications of applicants. Any national standardized or written examination 37 proctored by an independent third party which the board shall 38 39 approve as substantially similar to the examination required to be licensed under this chapter may be administered to all 40 applicants in lieu of or in conjunction with any other 41 42 examination which the board shall give to test the 43 qualifications of applicants. The board shall also have the right to may establish such norms of achievement as shall be 44 45 required for a passing grade. The board may, by rule, may 46 adopt the National Electrical Code for the purpose of 47 examinations.
  - (b) The board may recognize a license issued by any other state that, in the opinion of the board, has standards of practice or licensure equal to or higher than those required by this state. The board shall actively seek to reciprocate with those states meeting such standards. The board shall actively seek to maintain those states currently under agreement.
  - (c) No license shall be issued except in compliance with this chapter and none shall be issued except to a person

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or a person in a firm, partnership, association, or corporation. A firm, partnership, association, or corporation, as such, shall not be licensed. A licensee shall be a citizen of the United States or, if not a citizen of the United States, a person who is legally present in the United States with appropriate documentation from the federal government. (d) An individual who has successfully passed, before January 1, 2010, with a minimum score of 70 percent, or an individual who has successfully passed after January 1, 2010, with a minimum score of 75 percent, a nationally standardized proctored electrical examination administered in the State of Alabama, by Block and Associates, International Code Council, Experior, Promissor, Thomson Prometric, PROV, or any other exam approved by the board, shall be deemed to be in compliance with the testing requirement set forth by the board for licensure as an electrical contractor. Individuals meeting this qualification shall also be required to complete all other qualifications set forth by this chapter and the board prior to issuance of an electrical contractor license. Electrical contractor applicants affected by this provision shall have until July 1, 2011, to apply for licensure without any further examination requirements. (d) Commencing on the effective date of the act adding this subsection, no new provisional electrical contractor licenses may be issued by the board. Any person who is holding an active provisional electrical contractor license on that date may continue to apply for the annual renewal of that license by submitting to the board a completed application,



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- application fee, and supportive documentation establishing
  that he or she holds a valid local license or permit. A local
  license or permit issued by a county or municipality
  authorizes the holder to perform electrical contractor tasks
  and functions only within the boundaries of the issuing county
  or municipality. The provisional electrical contractor license
  does not expand the limited geographical boundaries imposed by
  the local license or permit."

- (a) Except as provided in Section 13A-9-111.1, it shall be unlawful for any person to violate any provision of this chapter regulating electrical contracting, and any person convicted of such violation shall be punished as prescribed for a Class A misdemeanor.
- (b) It shall be unlawful, except as otherwise provided, on or after December 31, 2011, for a person not licensed as an electrical contractor to solicit, represent, seek to perform, or perform those tasks and functions that can only be performed by a licensed electrical contractor in accordance with this chapter.
- (c) Subsection (b) shall not apply to an electrical contractor who has taken an examination offered by the board within the preceding 12 months, any person who holds a license or permit issued by a county or municipal government to perform the tasks and functions that can only be performed by a licensed electrical contractor, and who performs those tasks and functions within the boundaries of the county or municipality that issued the license or permit. Nothing in

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this chapter shall be construed to require a county to license 113 or permit electrical contractors." 114 115 Section 4. The Legislature concurs in the 116 recommendations of the Sunset Committee as provided in Sections 1, 2, and 3. 117 Section 5. This act shall become effective immediately.
