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SYNOPSIS:

This bill would provide that the Secretary of the Senate, the Clerk of the House of Representatives, the Director of the Legislative Services Agency, and the Chief Examiner of the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts may expend any available funds to purchase promotional items, items to recognize achievements and commemorate persons, and to purchase meals for staff in certain circumstances.

This bill would provide that an agency, department, board, bureau, commission, committee, institution, corporation, authority, or office of this state may expend public funds to purchase promotional items as necessary to carry out its statutory duties, to commemorate persons, and to purchase meals for staff during training and while in extended work sessions.

Under existing law, the Clerk of the House of Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate have access to certain spaces within the Capitol building and any place outside of the Capitol when the Legislature meets outside the Capitol.

This bill would clarify the particular spaces to which the Clerk of the House of Representatives, the Secretary of the Senate, and the Director of the Legislative Services Agency have access.



Under existing law, the Legislature has control of the usage of portions of streets adjacent to the State Capitol complex and grounds of the State Capitol building; portions of King Street and Pelham Street; the parking lot located across Union Street to the rear of the Capitol; the parking facilities connected to and adjacent to the State House; the lot bounded by Washington, Jackson, Pelham, and South Ripley Streets; and the driveway and parking spaces on the grounds surrounding the Capitol.

This bill would authorize the Legislature to control the entirety of these streets, if closed by the City of Montgomery, and require the Legislature to grant appropriate access to adjacent and surrounding property owners.

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The Secretary of the Senate, the Clerk of the House of Representatives, the Director of the Legislative Services
Agency, and the Chief Examiner of the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts may expend any available funds to purchase promotional items, items to recognize achievements or otherwise award staff, items to commemorate persons recognized by the Legislature, and to purchase meals for staff during training and while the Legislature is in legislative session with a certification that the staff were required or expected to work extended hours or through a regular meal time. Meals and other items provided pursuant to this section shall be



limited to amounts that comply with United States Internal Revenue Service guidance on de minimis fringe benefits.

Section 2. An agency, department, board, bureau, commission, committee, institution, corporation, authority, or office of this state may expend public funds for the purchase of promotional items of nominal value for the purpose of carrying out its statutory duties, items to commemorate persons recognized for achievement or exceptional performance, and to purchase meals for staff during training or extended work sessions. Meals and other items provided pursuant to this section shall be limited to amounts that comply with United States Internal Revenue Service guidance on de minimis fringe benefits.

Section 3. Section 29-1-19 and Section 29-1-19.1, as last amended by Act 2023-224, 2023 Regular Session, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

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(a) The Legislature of the State of Alabama may control the usage of a certain portion of those streets adjacent to the State Capitol complex in the City of Montgomery and the grounds of the State Capitol building, viz: That portion of King Street and Pelham Street, lying between Union and Ripley Streets (over which the city has relinquished control); the parking lot located across Union Street to the rear of the Capitol building between the administrative building and highway building and bounded by Union, Ripley, and King Streets and McDowell Lee Lane owned by the Legislative Council of the State of Alabama; the parking facilities connected to and adjacent to the former Highway Department Building and now designated "the Alabama State House"; all of that lot bounded by Washington, Jackson, and Ripley Streets and McDowell Lee Lane owned by the State of Alabama Retirement Systems of Alabama; and the driveway and parking spaces on the grounds surrounding the Capitol itself, all the aforesaid being exclusive of any right-of-way or rights-of-way or parking facilities now controlled by the City of Montgomery.

(b) The Legislature may exercise control over the usage of the areas through the joint parking committee created by Act No. 8, Organizational Session 1975, or its successor, or by subsequent legislative action; and the chief of services of the division of services shall work in cooperation with the Legislature regarding any action taken by the Legislature as
