## **Senate Bill 83**

**Senate Bill 83** as reported by the Committee on Judiciary would increase the obligations of the Fair Trial Tax Fund, paid from the State General Fund, by an estimated \$5.0 million dollars annually, according to the Office of Indigent Services (OIDS), beginning in Fiscal Year 2025, by revising the fee amounts paid to certain indigent defense attorneys, as follows:

Supreme Court	\$70/HR	\$85/HR	\$2,500	\$5,000

In addition, this bill would increase the administrative obligations of OIDS and the indigent defense advisory boards by an undetermined amount to comply with the provisions of this bill.
