Senate Bill 83

Senate Bill 83 as reported by the Committee on Ways and Means General Fund would increase the obligations of the Fair Trial Tax Fund, paid from the State General Fund, by an estimated \$5.0 million dollars annually, according to the Office of Indigent Services (OIDS), beginning in Fiscal Year 2025, by revising the fee amounts paid to certain indigent defense attorneys, as follows:

| Capital Offense | \$70/Hr | \$120/Hr | No Cap | No Cap |
| Class A felony | \$70/HR | \$100/HR | \$4,000 | \$6,000 |
| Class B felony | \$70/HR | \$80/HR | \$3,000 | \$4,000 |
| Class C/D felony | \$70/HR | \$80/HR | \$2,000 | \$3,500 |
| Juvenile | \$70/HR | \$70/HR | \$2,500 | \$4,500 |
| Other | \$70/HR | \$55/HR | \$1,500 | \$2,000 |
| Appeals | \$70/HR | \$85/HR | \$2,500 | \$5,000 |
| Supreme Court | \$70/HR | \$85/HR | \$2,500 | \$5,000 |

In addition, this bill would increase the administrative obligations of OIDS and the indigent defense advisory boards by an undetermined amount to comply with the provisions of this bill.
