12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
13	Section 1. Section 17-16-2, Code of Alabama 1975, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	<b>"</b> §17-16-2
16	(a) As used in this chapter, the term "expenses" shall
17	include the following items and any other items approved as
18	reimbursable expenses by the Election Expense Reimbursement
19	Committee pursuant to Section 17-16-2.1:
20	(1) The compensation and mileage provided by law for
21	election officials.
22	(2) The compensation provided by law for the clerk or
23	other official acting as absentee election manager.
24	(3) The cost of necessary training and associated
25	travel expenses as approved by the county commission for any
26	individual appointed as the absentee election manager pursuant
27	to Section 17-11-2.
28	$\frac{(3)}{(4)}$ The costs of ballots, supplies, and other



29	materials or equipment necessary for election officials to
30	conduct elections as required by law and as certified by the
31	judge of probate as chief election official of the county.
32	(5) The costs incurred by the county commission in
33	using electronic poll books pursuant to Section 17-4-2.1,
34	including essential support equipment, software updates,
35	populating the electronic poll books prior to each election,
36	maintenance of the electronic poll books, and any other
37	expenses necessary to comply with rules adopted by the
38	Secretary of State pursuant to Section 17-4-2.1.
39	(6) The costs incurred by the county commission in
40	using electronic voting machines, including, but not limited
41	to, the transport of electronic voting machines, essential
42	support equipment, software updates, maintenance of the
43	electronic voting machines, and storage of electronic voting
44	machines in non-governmental facilities.
45	(7) The costs incurred by the county commission for
46	rental payments to a facility used as a polling place.

- $\frac{(4)}{(8)}$  The costs of absentee ballots, supplies, 47 postage, and other materials required by law to be furnished 48 49 to the absentee election manager.
- 50 (5) (9) The cost of preparing and furnishing the lists 51 of qualified electors to the election officials as required by 52 law.

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(6) (10) The cost of publishing any notice or other item related to any election and required by law, including, but not limited to, the publication of notice of any election and any voter lists.



57	(b) Requests for reimbursement shall be submitted to
58	the Comptroller within 90 days following the date of the
59	election in which the expenses were incurred.
50	(c) This section shall apply to each primary and
51	general election beginning with the election on November 5,
52	<u>2024.</u> "
