83 (a) (1) The State Board of Veterans' Affairsboard shall

85 representatives, to serve for a term of four years from the 86 date of their respective appointments, who shall be selected 87 from the memberships of the Alabama Department of the American 88 Legion, the United Spanish American War Veterans, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Disabled American Veterans, Veterans of 89 90 WWI of the USA, Incorporated, the Vietnam Veterans of America, 91 AMVETS, the Military Order of the Purple Heart, the American 92 Ex-Prisoners of War, Incorporated, the Alabama Alliance of the Military Officers Association of America, Incorporated, 93 94 and the Marine Corps League_{au}.

237 The State Department of Veterans' Affairs, by the State Service Commissioner department, through the commissioner, with 238 239 the approval of the State Board of Veterans' Affairsboard, may contract with any organization of veterans which has 240 regularly, for a period of five years next preceding the date 241 242 of such the contract, has maintained an established committee or agency rendering similar services to veterans, similar to 243 244 as the services referred to in Section 31-5-4, to perform such 245 service the services for veterans and to process any claims or 246 matters of veterans who apply to the State Department of 247 Veterans' Affairs department for assistance when the veterans 248 have executed a power of attorney to the veterans' 249 organization. The department, through the contract, shall 250 compensate the veterans' organizations on the basis of service rendered, which compensation shall be paid from 251 252 sums appropriated to the State Department of Veterans'

(4) Maintain central case records of all veterans seeking services or benefits to <u>create a clearinghouse of</u> <u>information and facilitate the interchange of information and</u> case histories among the several state administrative agencies and the federal agencies to provide a clearinghouse of <u>information</u>.
