8	AN ACT
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10	Relating to crimes and offenses; to amend Section
11	13A-6-65, Code of Alabama 1975; to further provide for the
12	crime of sexual misconduct; to make nonsubstantive, technical
13	revisions to update the existing code language to current
14	style; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose
15	or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of
16	local funds within the meaning of Section 111.05 of the
17	Constitution of Alabama of 2022.
18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
19	Section 1. Section 13A-6-65, Code of Alabama 1975, is
20	amended to read as follows:
21	"\$13A-6-65
22	(a) A person commits the crime of sexual misconduct if
23	he or she does any of the following:
24	(1) Engages in sexual intercourse with another person
25	individual, without his or her consent, under circumstances
26	other than those covered by Sections 13A-6-61 and 13A-6-62; or
27	with consent where consent was obtained by the use of any
28	fraud or artifice.

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(2) Engages in sodomy with another <u>personindividual</u>, without his or her consent, under circumstances other than those covered by Sections 13A-6-63 and 13A-6-64; or with consent where consent was obtained by the use of fraud or artifice.

34 (3) Engages in sexual contact with another
35 personindividual, without his or her consent, under
36 circumstances other than those under Sections 13A-6-66,
37 13A-6-67, and 13A-6-69.1; or with consent where consent was
38 obtained by the use of fraud or artifice.

39 <u>(4) For the purposes of this section, "sexual contact"</u>
40 <u>includes the touching of any part of the body for sexual</u>
41 gratification.

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(b) Sexual misconduct is a Class A misdemeanor."

43 Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose 44 or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of 45 local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements 46 and application under Section 111.05 of the Constitution of 47 Alabama of 2022, because the bill defines a new crime or 48 amends the definition of an existing crime.

49 Section 3. This act shall become effective on October50 1, 2024.
